**REVIEW OF POLLING DISTRICTS  
AND POLLING PLACES 2007**

**Report by the Chief Executive**

**Summary**

The Report advises the Council of the review of the current Scheme of Polling Districts and Polling Places, as required by the Electoral Administration Act 2006. The Report outlines the responses received during the consultative process and suggests a number of amendments to the existing Scheme.

**Background**

1.1 Section 16 of the Electoral Administration Act 2006 (the EA Act) places a duty on the Council to divide its area into Polling Districts and designate Polling Places for those Polling Districts. Each Electoral Ward (within the meaning of section 1 of the Local Governance (Scotland) Act 2004) is to be divided into two or more separate polling districts. The Act requires that a review of Polling places is carried out within 12 months of the date that Section 16 came into force – i.e. 31 December 2007

1.2 The Council, at its Meeting held on 28 June 2007, set out the consultative framework for carrying out the review. The consultation has now taken place and 34 responses received. The Council is required to publish the responses received and this has been done, on the Council's Website at <http://www.highland.gov.uk/yourcouncil/elections/newboundarymaps-wards/>

2.0 **Polling District Review**

2.1 In carrying out the review, the Act requires that the following rules be applied:-

(a) the Council must seek to ensure that all electors in a constituency in its area have such reasonable facilities for voting as are practicable in the circumstances;

(b) the Council must seek to ensure that so far as is reasonable and practicable every polling place for which it is responsible is accessible to electors who are disabled;

(c) the Council must have regard to the accessibility to disabled persons

of potential polling stations in any place which it is considering designating as a polling place or the designation of which as a polling place it is reviewing;

- (d) the polling place for a polling district must be an area in the district, unless special circumstances make it desirable to designate an area wholly or partly outside the district;
- (e) the polling place for a polling district must be small enough to indicate to electors in different parts of the district how they will be able to reach the polling station.

2.2 The Report on the Review has been submitted to this meeting of the Council in order that alterations to polling districts can be timed to coincide with the 1 December publication of the annual revision of the register of electors. This will help to avoid confusion both for electoral professionals and other recipients of the register, including Political Parties.

2.3 It should be noted that representations against the outcome of the review may be made to the Electoral Commission by

- (i) not less than 30 electors in the Constituency;
- (ii) a person (other than the returning officer) who has made representations during the review, and
- (iii) a person who is not an elector in a constituency in the authority's area but who the Commission think has sufficient interest in the accessibility of disabled persons to polling places in the area or has particular expertise in relation to the access to premises or facilities of disabled persons.

A relevant representation is a representation that a review has not been conducted by the Council so as to (a) meet the reasonable requirements of the electors in the constituency or any body of those electors, or (b) take sufficient account of the accessibility to disabled persons of polling stations within a designated polling place.

### **3.0 Polling Districts**

3.1 Few comments were received on the Polling Districts in Highland, suggesting that electors are content with the current Scheme, which has evolved over decades. The proposed alterations to Polling Districts are outlined in the following 5 paragraphs. Maps detailing the proposed changes have been placed on the Council's website and can be found using the link shown in Paragraph 1.2

3.2 A representation has been received from Tongue Community Council that Skerray Village Hall be used as a Polling Place as residents of Skerray and Borgie have 8 miles to travel when voting. Approximately 95 electors live in the area and it is suggested that the Council agrees to split Polling District C01L and create a new Polling District in this area, with Skerray Village Hall as the

Polling Place, subject to agreement with the Hall Management Committee.

- 3.3 Doune Old Public School is the formally designated Polling Place for Polling District C01Q. The Owner of the building no longer wishes the premises to be designated as a Polling Place. The premises were not used at the 2007 Election. It is therefore suggested that the Polling District be merged with C01P (Rosehall Village Hall).
- 3.4 Kilmorack Community Council has submitted representations commenting on the inability of Kilmorack (near Beauly) residents to use Kilmorack Hall as their Polling Station. It is suggested that the western boundary of Polling District R13B be extended to match the western boundary of Kilmorack Community Council.
- 3.5 Kiltarlity Community Council have commented that a significant area within the Kiltarlity community falls within Polling District R13A. This area used to be part of a different Ward from the rest of Kiltarlity. The whole community is now within the new Aird and Loch Ness Ward. The Polling District is within the same Holyrood constituency of Ross, Skye and Inverness West as the rest of Kiltarlity, although boundary changes of the UK Parliament have divided the community and R13A is in a different Westminster constituency from I13A.
- It is therefore suggested that a new Polling District be created (R13D) from that part of R13A to the east of the River Beauly and electors allocated to vote at Kiltarlity Hall.
- 3.6 Polling District I13G has the former Dalreichart Primary School as its Polling Place. The School has now been sold and no alternative Polling place has been identified in the community (after consultation with the Community Council). The premises were not used at the 2007 election. It is therefore suggested that the Polling District be merged with I13F (Glenmoriston Village Hall, Invermoriston)
- 3.7 Polling Districts I21 A and B in the Laggan area were created to take account of the Cairngorms National Park Ward boundary. This created a number of anomalies, in that at the last election, some electors had to drive past Dalwhinnie Village Hall to vote at Laggan. It is suggested that these Polling Districts be divided and appropriate electors allocated to Dalwhinnie.

#### 4.0 **Polling Places**

- 4.1 As part of the Review, the premises used as Polling Places were examined. The type of buildings used as Polling Places varies greatly across Highland and are in a mixture of Public, Private and Community ownership. With regard to privately and community owned buildings, their use is agreed on a year to year basis, where election use is treated as a priority over all other bookings.
- 4.2 Some premises are very suitable for use at an election, being easily accessible within the community, good parking, easily accessible to electors with a disability, wide doorways, sympathetic lighting and colour contrast to assist people with a visual impairment and the Polling Equipment sensibly located

within the Polling Place. In others, there are different problems, to varying extent and degree, which affect an electors voting experience.

- 4.3 I have highlighted the Polling Places which have a difficulty in Appendix 1 to the Report, with the problem and solution (where possible) identified. Some Polling Places have accessibility problems which can be overcome through the installation of a ramp suitable for wheelchair users. It is proposed that the owners of these premises be contacted, in the first instance to make them aware of the problem. It is probable that in most cases the Council and the Returning Officer can resolve the access difficulties. It is proposed that the problems highlighted be tackled over the next 12 months and that a further report on Polling Places be submitted to the Council in October 2008.
- 4.4 One of the presumptions in selecting buildings for Polling Places is that wherever possible functioning schools should not be selected. However, in some cases, the School is the only community facility in the Polling District and has to be used in order not to inconvenience the electors there.
- 4.5 The proposed Scheme of Polling Districts and Polling Places is detailed in Appendix 2 to the Report and it is recommended for approval by the Council. The Scheme will be used by the Electoral Registration Officer in compiling the new Register, due for publication on 1 December 2007.
- 4.6 In terms of the Act, the Council has a duty to review the Scheme every 4 years. However, it is suggested that as premises can change ownership or experience a change in circumstances in a short period of time, proposed changes should be reported to the Council on an annual basis.

## **5.0 Recommendation**

5.1 It is recommended that the Council

- (a) Notes the representations received and the proposed actions outlined in Appendix 1
- (b) Seeks a report, in October 2008, outlining the actions taken to improve Polling Places and their outcomes;
- (c) Approves the Scheme of Polling Districts and Polling places as detailed in Appendix 2, and
- (d) Considers delegating authority to the Chief Executive, in consultation with the Convener, Vice Convener and appropriate Local Members, to make any necessary changes to the Scheme should circumstances arise prior to the next report in October 2008.
