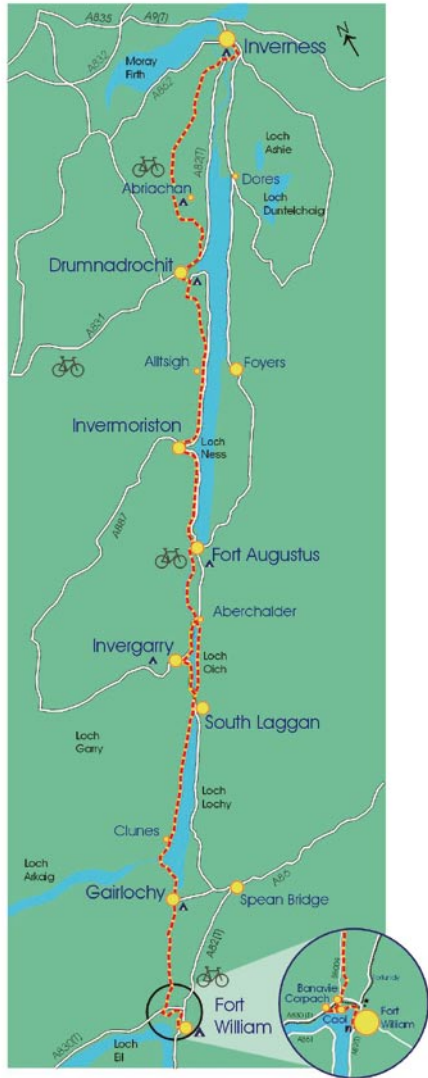

## THE GREAT GLEN WAY Long Distance Route

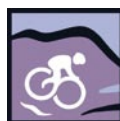


## Along the Way Air an t-Slighe

There are many ways to complete the Great Glen. You can walk the Great Glen Way, cycle the Great Glen Way or canoe the Great Glen using the lochs and the Caledonian Canal.



Starting (or ending) under the shadow of Britain's highest mountain, Ben Nevis, the routes traverse Britain's greatest geological fault and follow sections of Telford's historic Caledonian Canal.



The Great Glen Way long distance route can be travelled by mountain bike or by robust Hybrid bikes. There is no separate cycle route, although a national group is investigating options for touring bikes in the Glen. There are also separate high quality mountain bike trail locations within easy reach of the Way, providing the perfect level of challenge for all abilities of cyclist.



Using the historic Caledonian Canal and the lochs, it is easy to canoe the Great Glen. 2012 also sees the opening of the official Great Glen Canoe Trail, which will provide a quality experience for canoeists. Please note that the lochs should be considered as open water. British Waterways Scotland's canoeing guidelines are found here:

The Great Glen Way can be walked in 4-6 days, staying or camping overnight at the various communities within the Glen, and suits all levels of walker. For the less experienced it is the perfect introduction to long distance walking, being for the most part low-level and mainly following towpaths and woodland tracks.
