The suggested list of towns and larger villages where we intend to produce maps showing future development sites are listed below. The preparation of these maps will be led by the Council and therefore these communities are not eligible to prepare their own community plans.

For some other places not listed above we may prepare briefer planning guidance. This guidance will identify criteria to guide future development but will not provide a detailed map showing future development sites. These communities will still have the opportunity to produce their own plans however these will need to be consistent any criteria set out in the Plan.

We will consider such submissions and may offer assistance in how to produce the plan, how to consult on it and how to give it statutory status. We are piloting two such plans at present - one from the Isle of Rum Community Trust and one from Forestry Commission Scotland for a tourism development at Leanachan. This invitation is particularly suitable for those groups that wish to promote growth of their communities.

We have identified landscapes in the West Highland and Islands area that are important for their scenic quality; these are called Special Landscape Areas. These are in addition to nationally designated landscapes, called <u>National Scenic Areas^{iv}</u> .
