- 1. All pupils for whom English is an Additional Language i.e. bilingual pupils who may be:
 - a) New to English
 - b) Early Acquisition
 - c) Developing Competence
 - d) Competent
 - d) Fluent learners who function in 2+ languages.
- Class, subject, guidance & support teachers, classroom/nursery assistants, promoted staff, Speech & Language Therapists, Pupil Support Assistants and others who have contact with bilingual pupils.
- 3. Those working to further the aims of multicultural, anti-racist and bilingual education in Highland.

EAL teachers work collaboratively with staff in schools within the Highland Council Area to ensure:
