Application for the grant of a taxi driver's licence – Callum Train (Ward 19 – Nairn)

# **Report by the Principal Solicitor – Regulatory Services**

### Summary

This Report relates to an application for the grant of a taxi driver's licence.

This item is subject to a formal hearing procedure

### 1.0 Background

**1.1** The Highland Council has resolved that in terms of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 a licence will be required for the driving of a licensed taxi. A licence for the same is issued by the Highland Council and is valid for the whole Council Area.

## 2.0 Application

- **2.1** On 17 June 2016 an application for the grant of a taxi driver's licence was received from Mr Callum Train.
- **2.2** In terms of the abovementioned Act the Licensing Authority have six months from receipt of the application to determine the same, therefore this application must be determined by 16 December 2016. Failure to determine the application by this time would result in the application being subject of a `deemed grant' which means that a licence would require to be issued to Mr Train for a period of 1 year.

#### 3.0 Process

- **3.1** Following receipt of the application a copy of the same was circulated to the following Agencies/Services for consultation:
  - Police Scotland
  - Highland Council Trading Standards Service
- **3.2** Both Agencies/Services have confirmed that they have no objections to the application.

## 4.0 Taxi Driver's Knowledge Test

- **4.1** The Council's policy in respect of taxi driver's knowledge test states that an applicant is permitted a maximum of three attempts.
- **4.2** The applicant must achieve a pass mark of 85% or above for both sections of the test (Highland Section and Local Area Section). If one section of the test is passed the applicant would not require to re-sit this.

**4.3** Mr Train has only sat the test once due to other commitments and financial constraints and his marks is as follows:

1<sup>st</sup> Attempt – Highland Section – 59%; Local Area Section –66%

- **4.4** The applicant has arranged a re-sit for 1 December 2016
- **4.5** The application therefore cannot be determined under delegated powers as the applicant has not attained the required pass marks yet to enable his licence to be issued.
- **4.6** Members may wish to provide the Principal Solicitor with delegated powers to grant the taxi driver's licence if Mr Train passes the knowledge test by 15<sup>th</sup> December 2016 or to refuse the application if he has not passed it by this date.
