Review of Polling Districts, Local Government Elections to Highland Council 2017

Report by the Chief Executive

Summary

The purpose of this Report is to advise the Council of the review of Polling Districts required as a result of the 5th Review of Local Government Electoral Arrangements and its impact on Highland Council Polling Districts, for the forthcoming Local Government Elections to Highland Council in May 2017.

Maps 1-9 outlining the boundary changes in a number of Wards and proposed new polling districts in Ward 19 are provided at Appendix 1. Larger scale copies of the Maps are also available in the Members' Library.

1. Introduction

1.1 The Highland (Electoral Arrangements) Order 2016 came into force on 30th September 2016. This Order brought into being the boundaries, number and names of the 21 electoral wards for the Highland Council area for purposes of the elections to be held on or after the 4th May 2017.

2.0 New Wards

2.1 The Ward numbers, names of the wards and councillors to be elected are noted below. Those highlighted have been identified as having new boundaries that require Polling Districts to be amended. Although Nairn and Cawdor is a new Ward it does not need any realignment of Polling Districts.

- 4.2 Members are asked to agree the forming of two new polling districts in Ward 19 to cover Milton of Leys and Slackbuie, as outlined in Maps 8 and 9 at Appendix 1 to the report.


