Report title:	Application for the grant of a taxi driver's licence – Andrew Tunn (Ward 15 – Inverness Ness-Side)

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1.1 This Report relates to an application for the grant of a taxi driver's licence.

Recommendation

2.2 Members are asked to determine the application in accordance with the Council's Hearings Procedure.

3. Background

3.1 The Highland Council has resolved that in terms of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 a licence will be required for the driving of a licensed taxi. A licence for the same is issued by the Highland Council and is valid for the whole Council area.

4. Application

- **4.1** On 9 March 2017 an application for the grant of a taxi driver's licence was received from Mr Andrew Tunn.
- **4.2** In terms of the abovementioned Act the licensing authority have six months from receipt of the application to determine the same, therefore this application must be determined by 8 September 2017. Failure to determine the application by this time would result in the application being subject to a `deemed grant' which means that a licence would require to be issued to Mr Tunn for a period of 1 year. The application is before this Committee as this is the last meeting before the determination date expires.

5. Process

- **5.1** Following receipt of the application a copy of the same was circulated to the following Agencies/Services for consultation:
 - Police Scotland
 - Highland Council Trading Standards Service
- **5.2** Both Agencies/Services have confirmed that they have no objections to the application.
- **5.3** A right to work check has been completed in respect of this applicant and is satisfactory.

6. Taxi driver's knowledge test

6.1 The Council's policy in respect of taxi driver's knowledge test states that an applicant is require to sit and pass both sections of the test and is permitted a maximum of three attempts.

Mr Tunn has sat the test twice, with results detailed below:

- 6.2
- 1st Attempt Highland Area Pass 92% Local Area – Fail 69%
- 2nd Attempt Local Area Fail 69%
- **6.3** Mr Tunn has been contacted to arrange a further date for his re-test but to date has not sat this.

7. Policies

7.1 The following policies are relevant to this case:

8. Determining issues

8.1 Paragraph 5(3) of Schedule 1 of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 states that a licensing authority may refuse an application to grant or renew a licence where:

(a) the applicant or anyone else detailed on the application is not a fit and proper person;

(b) the activity would be carried out by a person other than the applicant who, if he had made the application himself, would have been refused;

(c) where the licence applied for relates to an activity consisting of or including the use of premises or a vehicle or vessel, those premises are not or, as the case may be, that vehicle or vessel is not suitable or convenient for the conduct of the activity having regard to

(i) the location, character or condition of premises or the character or condition of the vehicle or vessel,

- (ii) the nature and extent of the proposed activity,
- (iii) the kind of persons likely to be in the premises, vehicle or vessel,
- (iv) the possibility of undue public nuisance, or
- (v) public order or public safety; or
- (d) there is other good reason for refusing the application.
- **8.2** Section 13(5) of the Act also permits a licensing authority to refuse to grant a taxi driver's licence to a person who does not satisfy them that he has adequate knowledge of the area to which the licence is to relate, the layout of roads in that area and such other matters relating to the operation of a taxi as the authority considers desirable.
- **8.3** If required the Principal Solicitor Regulatory Services will offer particular advice on the criteria relating to this particular application.

A copy of this Report has been sent to the applicant who, in the terms of Paragraph 4(2) of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982, has been invited to attend and will be provided with an opportunity to be heard by the Committee. He has also been advised of the procedure which will be followed at the meeting.
