Questions

1. What are your likes and dislike regarding the Alness Academy building and facilities?

Likes: swimming pool; rugby facilities; canteen; near to High Street; spacious grounds; nice teachers & staff; good selection of subjects; early finish on Friday; good school; good community

Dislikes: windows; heating difficult to adjust; uncomfortable seats; no corridor in some areas; vegetation on roof; not enough outside seats; some carpets; toilets; building in poor state of repair

2. Is there anything in this school that you think should be taken to any new school?

Swimming pool; playing fields; PE facilities; rugby posts; canteen; teachers; bike shed; sports equipment; CDT equipment; ICT equipment;

There is a possibility of a single secondary school to serve the two towns.

Comments/views on general issues related to the possibility of the pupils at some time in the future <u>moving to a new-build school.</u>

Consideration as to whether or not the two towns of Alness and Invergordon would benefit from having a <u>single</u> secondary school or not.

3. How would you describe the relationship between the two towns?
