Application to vote by proxy at the Scottish Independence Referendum

How do I apply to vote by proxy?

- 1. You must ask someone who is willing and able to be your proxy and vote on your behalf. Please note that a person can only be the proxy for close relatives and up to two other people at the same election.
- 2. Fill in the application to vote by proxy. You must give a reason why you want to vote by proxy, for example you may be abroad on holiday on election day.
- 3. Make sure **you** complete all sections of the form and supply your date of birth and signature.
- 4. Return your form as soon as possible to one of the addresses shown below.

Please note: Your application form must arrive at your electoral registration office by 5pm **11 working days** before an election when changing or cancelling an existing proxy, postal or postal proxy vote and by 5pm **6 working days** before an election when applying for a new proxy vote.

Voting by Proxy

If you cannot vote at an election in person, you can apply to vote by proxy (someone else voting on your behalf). You can use this form to apply to vote by proxy for the Scottish Independence Referendum only.

What happens after I've returned this form?

- Your proxy must go to your local polling station to vote. If your proxy cannot get to the polling station, they can apply to vote for you by post. They can apply to do this by 5pm 11 working days before election day. They should contact the electoral registration office for more details.
- Your proxy will be sent a proxy poll card, telling them where and when to vote on your behalf.
- You should let your proxy know how you want them to vote on your behalf, for example, which candidate or which party.
- If it turns out that you are able to go to the
 polling station on election day, you can vote in
 person as long as your proxy has not already
 done so and has not applied to vote for you by
 post.
- You will need to give your date of birth and signature on this application form. This information is needed to prevent fraud. If you are unable to sign this form, please contact your Electoral Registration Officer.

Voting by Proxy

A person can only be a proxy for close relatives and up to two other people at an election.

Close relatives are the spouse, civil partner, parent, grandparent, brother, sister, child or grandchild of the applicant.

The proxy must be eligible to vote in the election.
