Consultation

Community views on these options and the draft Green Framework will be sought by The Highland Council. Opportunities to submit comments have been advertised in the local press and at key community locations across the A96 Corridor.

Further, staffed exhibitions are to take place at Inshes Church on 11 September, Culloden Library on 13 September and Nairn Community Centre on 14 September.

Comments are actively encouraged and these have to be submitted by 25 September 2006. These will be considered in developing finalised proposals.

Next Steps

In parallel with consultation, Halcrow will be undertaking further stakeholder engagement through Collaboration for Success sessions on 20 September for Nairn South and 21 September for East Inverness. Further details can be obtained by emailing A96corridor@halcrow.com.

In addition, the Framework Planning Groups (see Newsletter 1) are considering the options during September.

Technical considerations are on-going in relation to:

- * Service provision (e.g. schools, community services, health and leisure).
- Commercial viability.
- * Deliverability.
- * Planning (including viable placemaking, transport & access, drainage, land use, landscape and natural environment).

These considerations will allow finalised frameworks and a green framework to be prepared for the beginning of October.
