## Transport Information Summary – Ward 21 – Badenoch & Strathspey

- 1. Information for the Badenoch & Strathspey area.
- 2. All bus services in the area are operated under contract to The Highland Council, except for the Scottish Citylink services which pass through the area along the A9 corridor.
- 3. The Highland Council's overall spending in the area for school, public and dial-a-bus services is close to £1.2million. The sum spent on public transport and those services which are a mix of public/school transport is over £814,000.
- 4. Significant public transport contracts include:
  - Dalfaber Cairngorm
  - Aviemore Grantown Inverness
  - Newtonmore Carrbridge
  - Grantown area dial-a-bus.
- 5. The Highland Council also funds Badenoch & Strathspey Community Transport Company at £40,000 annually.
- 6. Issues are:
  - Pattern and capacity are largely determined by school requirements. There are very few small buses available to do off-peak work between school runs.
  - Main routes generally work as a network but historically it has been difficult to attract competition for them.
  - Future demand for transport to new hospital in Aviemore.
- 7. It is intended to have new contracts in place on 1 January 2017. Key steps in the process are:
  - Member consultation
  - Community consultation
  - Supplier Briefings and Public Contracts Scotland tender/auction training
  - Routes and Specifications development
  - Tender phase
  - Highland Council Committee and Project Partner approvals
  - Award process
  - Contract implementation
