Transport Information Summary – Ward 19 – Nairn

- 1. Information for Nairn ward plus Cawdor area, i.e. Nairn Associated School Group area.
- 2. The main bus services through the area (Stagecoach Services 10 & 11) are operated commercially. Contracts funded by The Highland Council provide the remaining services.
- 3. The Highland Council's overall spending in the area for school, public and dial-a-bus services is £425,000. The sum spent on public transport and those services which are a mix of public/school transport is £184,000.
- 4. Significant public transport contracts include:
 - Nairnshire dial-a-bus
 - Nairn town service (Tradespark / High Street / Hospital / Boath Park / Lochloy)
 - Cawdor Nairn (principally a school bus but tendered as a public service)
- 5. The Highland Council also funds Nairn Community Transport (up to £6,250.00 annually).
- 6. Issues are:
 - Nairnshire dial-a-bus is at full capacity for one vehicle. There has been demand for it to cover Nairn town and the Nairn Ardersier route, but this is only possible at the cost of reducing the service in its existing area.
 - Nairn town service was previously funded from a developer contribution. It is not currently budgeted for but is reasonably well used, and there is demand for a service later in the day.
- 7. It is intended to have new contracts in place on 1 January 2017. Key steps in the process are:
 - Member consultation
 - Community consultation
 - Supplier Briefings and Public Contracts Scotland tender/auction training
 - Routes and Specifications development
 - Tender phase
 - Highland Council Committee and Project Partner approvals
 - Award process
 - Contract implementation
