Summary of nature/ content of PPS	 The development framework is being produced to address the following principles: the timely, safe and environmentally acceptable decommissioning, restoration and after-use of the Dounreay site; phasing through to the interim end point, setting out the developments required for decommissioning and restoration towards achieving the site end state, including new build, adaptation, demolition and remediation; sufficient flexibility to respond to changing constraints whilst not placing undue restrictions on the site operator; indication of potential new interim uses and end uses for parts of the site in support of economic regeneration of the area; and developer requirements as set out in Appendix 5 of the Revised Environmental Report of the HwLDP relating to Policy 24: Dounreay. The Council will work with the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority towards the early identification of opportunities for the economic reuse of existing Dounreay facilities and land. TABLE 2 – SUMMARY OF ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS

This revised Dounreay Planning Framework document will be used by the Highland Council when considering Dounreay's planning applications and to regulate and control future decommissioning and restoration proposals.

It is recognised that development of this area will have an effect on the environment. However, the principle of preparing a development framework for this area has been set by the Highland-wide Local Development Plan (HwLDP). The HwLDP has been subject to Strategic Environmental Assessment which considered the policy implications but also carried out a site assessment, which has identified mitigation. These mitigation measures will be fully integrated into the development framework. It should also be noted that given the past use of this site it is not possible to fully restore the site to the state prior to the development of the Dounreay Nuclear Power Station on the site but through the considered approach to the timely, safe and environmentally acceptable decommissioning, restoration and after-use of the site there will be a positive effect on the environment; it is not considered that this will be significant.

Given the proximity to the North Caithness Cliffs SPA there may be an effect on a European designated site, as such Habitats Regulations Appraisal will be under taken at an appropriate stage to inform, in due course, the content of the final version of the development framework which is to be adopted as statutory supplementary guidance.

The reason that the details contained within the proposed development framework is to be included in a development framework rather than the plan itself is to ensure the development of a succinct local development plan. This will also ensure that the most relevant, flexible and up to date to framework is in place to facilitate delivery of development. This flexibility enables the provisions of the development framework to be a statutory part of the development plan, rather than being reviewed with the HwLDP or Caithness and Sutherland Local Development Plan on a 5 year cycle.
