ARMED FORCES COMMUNITY

The following is a statement by Mr Tobias Ellwood, Minister of State for Defence:

"The Armed Forces Covenant is a promise by the nation that those who serve and have served and their families are not disadvantaged as a result of their service. The provision of educational support for the children of Service personnel is primarily the responsibility of the relevant educational authorities and I am grateful to colleagues in the Department for Education for their continued support for the Covenant through both the Service Pupil Premium and individual projects, including the £2.8 million recently announced to support the expansion of the Army in the Salisbury Plain area. I am also grateful to colleagues in the Welsh Government for creating a £200,000 fund this year to support Service children in Wales, which I hope can be extended.

In light of the ongoing drawdown from Germany and to provide time for the educational authorities across the UK to bring in longer-term provision for Service children as necessary,

I am pleased to announce that I have asked the MOD to extend the ESF, on a limited basis, for two years. The fund will consist of £3 million this year and £2 million in 2019-20".

Army Welfare Service Community Support

Tri-Service Youth Forum Helensburgh 25th -29th June 2018

9 young people from Inverness, Kinross and Lossiemouth joined teenagers from across the UK for the Tri - Service Youth Forum at Blairvadach. During the week-long residential, the group was hosted by the RNRM staff Sophia Moordie and Rebekah Hill from Faslane Naval Base, who had arranged an exciting programme of outdoor activities alongside the all-important Youth Forum. Several guest speakers including senior Naval personnel, representatives from local Government & Carolyn Macleod, the ADES National Transition Officer visited during the week. This provided young people with the chance to 'grill' the naval officers, learn more about the new websites being developed to support military dependants as well as participating in an exciting workshop delivered by the cartoonist, Rossi Stone.

The group from Highlands contributed to the discussions, sharing personal experiences and participated in all sessions, speaking passionately about the issues that affect them and proposing new ways of tackling these problems. They demonstrated a great deal of confidence and insight throughout the week.



New friendships were made, common themes identified, and more importantly, the young people left with a determination to create their own Forum in the North, ensuring that every young person has a voice and opportunity to shape delivery of the support they need. It is hoped that the group will host a two day 'Teen Talks' in October for young people with a military connection- more details to follow!

Armed Forces Covenant

As this is the first newsletter, it is perhaps useful to outline what the Covenant is and how it benefits the Armed Forces (AF) community.

Covenant means pledge or promise and the AF Covenant is a promise by the nation that those who serve, or have served and their families are treated fairly.

Highland Council fulfils its pledge by supporting the local AF community in a number of ways, the MLG (Education) being one of them. Wider issues are addressed through the AF Community Covenant Group with representatives from Army and RAF units, Reserve units, local authority, DWP, NHS, military and veterans' charities.

Delivery of the Covenant is backed by the AF Covenant Fund Trust which receives £10 million per year from the Ministry of Defence for projects that support the AF community. Highland and Moray have received almost £178,000 over the last 3 years for such projects.

If you have a project that would benefit the community the Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust website has information on successful projects and how to apply.
