I hope you charge a decent fee to cover your costs and hopefully make a profit too, I wish there were more positive thinking regarding this service.



Can I just say what a good idea I think it is to include a waste disposal point for motor homes.


We have a house in the area and have seen a huge increase in the number of motorhomes and other traffic since the NC500 Route was launched.
