


#### Location

Kingussie is the former administrative capital of Badenoch and is a popular tourist destination, situated as it is within the Cairngorm National Park. Located just off the A9, Kingussie is 45 miles South of the City of Inverness and benefits from excellent transport links North and to the central belt. The A9 is undergoing a multi-billion pound dualling project, the result of which will greatly reduce travel times and improve the already excellent communication links with the rest of the country.





## Description

The Category C Listed Former Highland Folk Museum is located on Duke Street in the centre of Kingussie. The site extends to approximately 2.2 acres, and comprises of four main buildings, Pitman Lodge, McRobert House, the Former Farming Museum, and a Workshop & Stores.
