

What can you do in ELC?

Entry Criteria

(SSSC registration for <u>all</u> posts)

You need 3 years qualified experience to become a Childcare manager, and to be working towards a management qualification required by SSSC.

You can become a Senior EYP after gaining ELC experience and the relevant qualifications.

You can get a job as an EYP1 without a qualification, but you must work towards achieving this qualification.
Once you have it, you can move to EYP2.

You can get a job as a support worker without any relevant qualifications, as long as you work towards them in a few years.
