C1028 CHERRY PARK, BALLOCH, INVERNESS
RAISED TABLE/UNCONTROLLED PEDESTRIAN CROSSING

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that **The Highland Council**, in terms of the powers contained in section 36 and 37 of the **Roads (Scotland) Act 1984** as amended and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf **propose to construct 1 raised table** to facilitate pedestrian crossing on the C1028 Cherry Park, Balloch, Inverness as follows:

- Raised table on C1028 Cherry Park located 194 metres or thereby Southwest of its junction with the C1028 Culloden Road, Balloch, Inverness.

Table 100mm in height (max) 6m wide kerb to kerb and 5.25m long (including tapers). Red anti-skid surfacing applied for the full road width over central 3m length highlighting the crossing point.

In terms of Section 7 and Schedule 6 Part 3 paragraph 9 of the Coronavirus (Scotland) Act 2020, the Council has decided not to make the schedule and plans available for public inspection or publicise them other than by electronic means because to do otherwise may give rise to a significant risk of the transmission of coronavirus.
