THE HIGHLAND COUNCIL (B9090 CAWDOR, B9090 AND B9101) (30 MPH AND 50 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2020

The Highland Council in exercise of their powers under Section 84 and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended (which Act as so amended is hereinafter referred to as "the 1984 Act"), and of all the other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Constable in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act hereby make the following order:-

1. This Order may be cited as 'The Highland Council (B9090 Cawdor, B9090 and B9101) (30 mph and 50 mph Speed Limit) Order 2020' and shall come into operation on 12 February 2021.
2. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this order as it applies for the Interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
3. All provisions contained in any Order enactment or others insofar as the same are inconsistent with the provisions of this Order and the true intent and meaning hereof shall cease to have effect and are hereby revoked. In particular, the 40 miles per hour speed limit contained in paragraph 4 of The Highland Council (Cawdor)(Speed Limit) Order 2007 is hereby revoked.

ROADS (30 AND 50 MPH)

4. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle on the lengths of road specified in Part I of the Schedule annexed and signed as relative to this Order at a speed in excess of 30 miles per hour.
5. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle on the lengths of road specified in Part II of the Schedule annexed and signed as relative to this Order at a speed in excess of 50 miles per hour.
6. Vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 are exempt from the restriction detailed in this Order when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those regulations

SCHEDULE

Part I

B9090	that length of the B9090 road commencing at a point 30 metres or thereby west of its junction with the U3151 Budgate – Inchyettle – Cawdor road and extending in a north easterly direction for a distance of 725 metres or thereby.

Part II

B9090	that length of the B9090 road commencing at a point 50 metres or thereby north east of its junction with the C1154 Cawdor – Newlands of Inchnacaorach road and extending in a north easterly direction for a distance of 1840 metres or thereby.
B9090	that length of the B9090 road commencing at a point 20 metres or thereby north east of its junction with the U3138 extending in a north easterly direction for a distance of 1542 metres or thereby to its junction with the B9101.
B9101	that length of the B9101 road from its junction with the B9090 road to its junction with the A939 road

in particular, the 40 miles per hour speed limit contained in paragraph 4 of The Highland Council (Cawdor) (Speed Limit) Order 2007 is hereby revoked.

ROADS (30 AND 50 MPH)

4. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle on the lengths of road specified in Part I of the Schedule except as signposted as to speed limit of 30 miles per hour.

5. No person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle on the lengths of road specified in Part II of the Schedule unless signposted as to speed limit in excess of 50 miles per hour.

6. Vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 are exempt from the restriction detailed in this Order when used in accordance with regulation 3(2) of those regulations
