

Kyle of Sutherland Tourism Infrastructure (KoSTI Project) Project Initiation Document (PID) | September 2020

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
Project Context

To manage the rise in visitor pressure points across the Kyle of Sutherland by providing supportive tourism infrastructure, illustrating the significance of the Kyle of Sutherland area through community asset ownership in turn supporting local economy and embracing the tourism opportunities.

Kyle of Sutherland Development Trust wish to develop three sites across the Kyle of Sutherland to create Kyle of Sutherland Tourism Infrastructure (KoSTI) project, which aims to support tourism in the area. It will create better facilities for visitors whilst reducing issues such as increased waste, impacts on parking and pressures on local services.

This project aims to develop sustainable tourism in the area around the Kyle of Sutherland by providing facilities for visitors who choose to come to the area in campervans, motorhomes and electric vehicles (including cyclists). The provision will help to ease tourism pressure points across the north. The route around the Dornoch Firth and the Kyle of Sutherland creates a great spur off the NC500 and offers options to head west and north, as well as the narrowest crossing of Scotland. Although the area has been hit economically, it remains an area of outstanding natural beauty with strong, but underpromoted, cultural heritage. The success of the NC500 has shown the potential for tourism in the Highlands, however, there is a need to grow tourism, from a low base, in a sustainable manner.

Project Parameters

Phase Delivery: The development of Kyle of Sutherland Tourism Infrastructure (KoSTI) project will be narrated by Rural Tourism Infrastructure Funding Timeline.

Project Development

- Phase 1 | Project Idea Initiated from community voice and visitor pressure points. Expression of Interest to Rural Tourism Infrastructure Fund submitted.
- Phase 2 | Expression of Interest approved. A £5,000 Design Grant with a further 50% match funding (total £10,000) was awarded to support initial and further development of project.
- Phase 3 | Development of the project viability and design up to the submission of a Planning Application for each site.
- Phase 4 | Funding Application Decision

- Phase 6 | Defects Period Completed and Final RTIF Claim Submitted

Financial:

Design and development stages of the project have been supported by a Rural Tourism Infrastructure Fund design grant of £5,000 and a further 50% of match funding (total funding: £10,000). In addition to this in-kind value has grown and developed the project.

The capital project is dependent on key funding from Rural Tourism Infrastructure Fund alongside relevant match funding. The project is also supported by in-kind value.

The operational running of the project will be sustained by charging a small fee for facilities.

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
