NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that The Highland Council proposes to make an Order in terms of Section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 entitled as above.

If the Order comes into force, the Order will introduce a 30mph speed limit on the following roads in Dulnain Bridge:

Route A938 – BLACKMOUNT - CARRBRIDGE - DUTHIL - DULNAIN BRIDGE ROAD Commencing at a point 455 metres of thereby west of its junction with the A95 Trunk Road and extending in a westerly direction for a distance of 604 metres or thereby.

Route B9178 – DULNAIN BRIDGE - EASTER CURR ROAD (Former Trunk Road A95) Commencing at its junction with the A938 and extending generally south then south-easterly for a distance of 180 metres or thereby.

Route C1122 - SKYE OF CURR ROAD

Commencing at its junction with the B9178 and extending generally west then southernly for a distance of 2000 metres or thereby.

In terms of Section 7 and Schedule 6 Part 3 paragraph 9 of the Coronavirus (Scotland) Act 2020, the Council has decided not to make the schedule and plans available for public inspection or publicise them other than by electronic means because to do otherwise may give rise to a significant risk of the transmission of coronavirus.
