



THE CONSERVATION (NATURAL HABITATS, &C.) REGULATIONS 1994 (AS AMENDED)

LICENCE TO DISTURB MARINE SPECIES

Licence Number: EPS/BS-00009225

This licence is granted under regulation 44(e) of the Conservation (Natural Habitats, &c.) Regulations 1994 (as amended) by the Scottish Ministers who, after consultation with, and having been advised as to the circumstances in which they should grant such licences by NatureScot are satisfied as regards the purpose for which the licence is granted, namely, for (e) preserving public health or public safety or other imperative reasons of overriding public interest including those of a social or economic nature and beneficial consequences of primary importance for the environment; and that (a) there is no other satisfactory alternative and (b) that the action authorised will not be detrimental to the maintenance of the population of the species concerned at a favourable conservation status in their natural range; and unless revoked by the Scottish Ministers is valid from 31 July, 2021 to 18 July, 2023 and authorises:

Or any person authorised in writing by him / her to disturb the European protected species of harbour porpoise (Phocoena phocoena);bottlenose dolphin (Tursiops truncatus);minke whale (Balaenoptera acutorostrata);short beaked common dolphin (Delphinus delphis);white-beaked dolphin (Lagenorhynchus albirostris) at UIG HARBOUR, as detailed in the application for a licence to disturb European Protected Species and supporting documents but only subject to the under-noted conditions:

PURPOSE AND CIRCUMSTANCES IN WHICH ACTION IS REQUIRED

This licence is granted for the purpose of permitting the disturbance of harbour porpoise (Phocoena phocoena); bottlenose dolphin (Tursiops truncatus); minke whale (Balaenoptera acutorostrata); short beaked common dolphin (Delphinus delphis); white-beaked dolphin (Lagenorhynchus albirostris) at UIG HARBOUR, for (e) preserving public health or public safety or other imperative reasons of overriding public interest including those of a social or economic nature and beneficial consequences of primary importance for the environment in connection with Uig harbour redevelopment. at the following location:

This licence is granted for permitting disturbance of the above named species as a result of the following activities:

Impact Piling

LICENCE CONDITIONS

- 1. The Licensee must ensure that all works are carried out in strict accordance with the mitigation and working methods proposed in the application for this licence to disturb European protected species, together with supporting information and all works must be carried out within the timescale(s) given within the application and any subsequent written correspondence between Marine Scotland and the applicant, but subject to the following modifications or amendments made within this licence.
- 2. The Licensee must ensure that all licensed activities are carried out in strict accordance with the Uig Harbour Redevelopment European Protected Species Licence Application Supporting Information Marine Mammal Risk Assessment UHRD-ACM-ZZ-GE-RP-EN-00004.
- 3.The Licensee must ensure that the activities are carried out in accordance with a Marine Mammal Management Plan ("MMMP") which the Licensee must submit, in writing, to the licensing authority for their written approval, no later than two months prior to the activities commencing or at such a time as agreed with the licensing authority. It is not permissible for any activities to proceed prior to the granting of such approval. In the event that the Licensee wishes to update or amend any of the protocols in the MMMP, the Licensee must submit, in writing, details of proposed updates or amendments to the licensing authority for their written approval, no later than one month or at such a time as agreed with the licensing authority, prior to the planned implementation of the proposed updates or amendments. It is not permissible for any activities associated with the proposed updates or amendments to proceed prior to the granting of such approvals.

The MMMP must include consideration of:

- a) the employment of a Marine Mammal Observer ("MMO")
- b) details of the locations and experience of the MMO
- c) details of the experience of the Passive Acoustic Monitoring ("PAM") operators
- d) location of the PAM system and when it is to be used
- e) details of the MMO pre-piling watch
- f) details of the communication protocol between the MMO and PAM operators and piling contractors
- g) details of any underwater noise measurement protocols, including the type of system to be used, how the noise levels will be analysed and calibrated and how the levels will be reported to the licensing authority
- h) establishment of a 100m piling mitigation zone for harbour seals and 500m piling mitigation zone for cetaceans
- i) details of the piling soft start procedure.
- 4. In the event of the Licensee becoming aware that any of the information on which the issue of this licence was based has changed, the licensing authority must be notified as soon as reasonably practicable.
- 5. The Licensee must ensure that, if any aspects of the proposed activities differ from the detail submitted in the Noise Registry Initial Registration Form, a new Initial Registration Form shall be completed and submitted to the licensing







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authority and the Joint Nature Conservation Committee (JNCC) no later than one week prior to commencement of the licensed activity.

- 6. The Licensee must ensure that where survey equipment has the capability to undergo a soft start procedure, this is implemented on every occasion survey equipment is switched on.
- 7. The Licensee must ensure that the Joint Nature Conservation Committee ('JNCC') 2010 Guidelines for minimising the risk of injury and disturbance to marine mammals from piling is followed at all times in connection with the undertaking of such surveys as far as it is practical to do so. - 8. Except where it is not relevant to the provisions of this licence, the Licensee must ensure that the Scottish Marine Wildlife Watching Code is adhered to at all times.
- 9. The Licensee must ensure that copies of the licence are available for inspection by any person authorised by the Scottish Ministers at the office of the Licensee and at all sites where licensed activities are taking place.
- 10. Any person authorised by the Scottish Ministers must be permitted to inspect the operations relating to the licence at any reasonable time. The Licensee must allow appropriate assistance to facilitate inspection.
- 11. The Licensee must, no later than one month after the expiry date of this licence, submit to Marine Scotland, Planning and Policy, Licensing Operations Team, a written report detailing all actions taken in accordance with the specified terms and conditions of the licence. This report must detail the procedures, visual observations and include the original Marine Mammal Recording Form(s). Any difficulties encountered, or recommendations should also be noted.
- 12. The licence holder must, no later than 12 weeks after completion of the noisy activity, complete a 'close-out' noise registry form. This is available from the JNCC website https://mnr.jncc.gov.uk/
