BUILD OUT ON C1016 ARDROSS ROAD, ALNESS
and
PAIR OF SPEED CUSHIONS AND BUILD OUT (ROAD NARROWING) ON U1963
CAPLICH ROAD, ALNESS

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that **The Highland Council**, in terms of the powers contained in section 36 and 37 of the **Roads (Scotland) Act 1984** as amended and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf **propose to construct a build out on C1016 Ardross Road, Alness and propose to construct a pair of speed cushions and build out (road narrowing) on U1963 Caplich Road, Alness** to facilitate pedestrian access to Bridgend Primary school as follows:

- Build out on C1016 Ardross Road located 162 metres or thereby North of the U1960 Perrins Road/C1016 Ardross Road Junction, Alness.

The build out is located in the southbound lane, 0.9m wide flushed to the footpath at the East side of the carriageway, has an upstand to match existing kerb levels and is 5.7m in length reducing the carriageway width to 4.0m kerb to kerb. The priority is given to vehicles travelling North.

- Pair of speed cushions U1963 Caplich Road 6 metres or thereby North West of the U1985 Caplich Hill/U1963 Caplich Road Junction, Alness

The speed cushions are 75mm in height (max), 1700 mm wide and 1900 mm in length with approach ramp gradient of 1:8 and slope gradient of 1:4.

- Road Narrowing on the U1963 at the North side of the U1960 Perrins Road/ U1964 Springfield Terrace/U1963 Caplich Road Junction, Alness

The road narrowing is on both sides at the same position along the carriageway and will consist of a build out 0.8m wide flushed to the footpath at the west side of the carriageway and a build out on the East 0.8m flushed to the footpath. Both build outs have an upstand to match existing kerb levels and are 6.5m in length reducing the carriageway width to 4.0m kerb to kerb. The priority is given to vehicles travelling Northerly.

In terms of Section 7 and Schedule 6 Part 3 paragraph 9 of the Coronavirus (Scotland) Act 2020, the Council has decided not to make the schedule and plans available for public inspection or publicise them other than by electronic means because to do otherwise may give rise to a significant risk of the transmission of coronavirus.
