

**THE HIGHLAND COUNCIL
PAIR OF SPEED CUSHIONS AND RAISED ZEBRA CROSSING ON U1855
KEPPOCH ROAD, CULLODEN**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that **The Highland Council**, in terms of the powers contained in section 36 and 37 of the **Roads (Scotland) Act 1984** as amended and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf **propose to construct a pair of speed cushions and raised zebra crossing on U1855 Keppoch Road, Culloden** to facilitate pedestrian access to Bridgend Primary school as follows:

Description of the proposed speed cushions:-

- First speed cushion is centred at the road narrowing (build out) 34 metres or thereby Northeast of U1870 Blackthorn Road, U1855 Keppoch Road, Culloden
- Second speed cushion is centred at the road narrowing (build out) 84 metres or thereby Northeast of U1870 Blackthorn Road, U1855 Keppoch Road, Culloden

The speed cushions 75mm in height (max), 1650 mm wide and 2000 mm in length with approach ramp gradient of 1:8 and slope gradient of 1:4.

Description of the proposed raised zebra crossing:-

- Raised zebra crossing is at the location of the existing zebra crossing, 21 metres or thereby Southwest of U1870 Blackthorn Road, U1855 Keppoch Road, Culloden

The raised zebra crossing is 75mm in height (max), full road width and 5050mm in length with approach ramp gradient of 1:15.

In terms of Section 7 and Schedule 6 Part 3 paragraph 9 of the Coronavirus (Scotland) Act 2020, the Council has decided not to make the schedule and plans available for public inspection or publicise them other than by electronic means because to do otherwise may give rise to a significant risk of the transmission of coronavirus.
