Ellie O'Gorman, was awarded the Celebrating Forces Families 2022 "Young People's Award" for her outstanding work in supporting the Forces young people within the Inverness area. The award celebrates her volunteering contribution, position on the Armed Forces Youth Voice and efforts in making sure all Forces Children within the Inverness area are seen and heard.

At Millburn Academy, Ellie is a Nurture Mentor who encourages some

of our most vulnerable pupils to take part in extracurricular activities, especially the Armed Forces Youth Club. She has a natural ability to make people feel at ease and regularly leads successful group activities over break times. She is also a senior buddy to Millburn pupils who have a parent/carer in the Forces/Reservists/Veterans. She also helps Forces pupils with their transition from Primary to Secondary School. Through this and her involvement in establishing and running a Youth Club on the Army Families



Estate in Inverness, she has gained Highlife Highland Leadership and Saltire awards.

Ellie's motivation comes from her own experience as a Forces child. She's determined to highlight the needs of Forces young people and their families and encourages all schools and agencies to be "Forces family" aware.

The original resource created through collaboration of Education Scotland, ADES National Transitions Officer, and Forces Children Scotland (formerly RCET), is available for educators on GLOW (Professional Learning Activity).

Educators, and other professionals, can utilise this resource to gain a greater understanding of the experiences and life journeys of armed forces families. It will enable them to be more informed when working with families to provide necessary educational and pastoral support and be better placed to support positive mental health and wellbeing over challenges such as mobility, separation, and loss. Having the resource available on various online sites will reach a wider audience.

She previously worked at Action for Children, and has worked with Children and Young People for ten years.






the Highlands, that will ensure your rights are protected and that you have an equal say/view in all matters and decisions that may affect you.




