THE HIGHLAND COUNCIL (PROHIBITION AND RESTRICTION OF WAITING AND LOADING AND PARKING PLACES) (DECRIMINALISED PARKING ENFORCEMENT AND CONSOLIDATION) VARIATION FOR ROSEMARKIE EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2023

Statement of Reasons

The Council has introduced a traffic management scheme on an experimental basis using two experimental orders in terms of Sections 9 & 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, namely The Highland Council (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting on Loading and Parking Places) (Decriminalised Parking Enforcement and Consolidation) Variation for Rosemarkie Experimental Order 2023 and The Highland Council (C1218 Mill Road & Marine Terrace, Rosemarkie)(One Way) Experimental Order 2023. The traffic management scheme has been introduced to address road safety issues specifically relating to pedestrian safety on Marine Terrace, High Street and Hawkhill Road, Rosemarkie and to assist with traffic management and coastal protection issues by preventing vehicles damaging the verge adjacent to the shoreline. Together, the experimental orders mentioned above address those issues.

The Highland Council (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting on Loading and Parking Places) (Decriminalised Parking Enforcement and Consolidation) Variation for Rosemarkie Experimental Order 2023 introduces (i) No Waiting at Any Time and No Waiting 9pm-8am restrictions on certain roads in order to secure the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of vehicular and pedestrian traffic and (ii) Residents Permit & Disabled Persons' Parking Places in order to secure the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on the road for residents and disabled persons' vehicles by excluding parked vehicles not validly displaying a residents permit or disabled persons badge.

The reason for making an experimental order rather than a permanent order is to enable the effect of its provisions to be assessed before the Council considers whether the provisions of the traffic management scheme should be continued indefinitely by means of another order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on 24th April 2023 The Highland Council made the above Order ("the Experimental Order") in exercise of the powers conferred on them under Sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to said Act. The Experimental Order has been made as part of an experimental scheme of traffic control.

The Experimental Order will come into force on the 8th of May 2023 and will remain in operation for a period not exceeding 18 months.

The effect of the Experimental Order is to prohibit/restrict the use of roads in Rosemarkie and Chanonry areas as follows:

- (1) No Waiting at Any Time
 Vehicles will be prohibited from waiting or parking at any time on certain lengths of the
 following roads as identified on the maps accompanying the Experimental Order ("the
 Maps"): Marine Terrace, A832 High Street, Hawkhill Road, Ness Road, Ness Road east
- (2) No Waiting 9pm-8am
 Vehicles will be prohibited from waiting on certain lengths of Marine Terrace as identified on the Maps between 9pm and 8am every night of the week

Exemptions to (1) & (2) above will apply for disabled persons' vehicles displaying a valid Blue Badge and vehicles (ii) being used in connection with certain operations including building, shop fitting and Royal Mail deliveries (iii) in respect of which dispensation has been granted by The Highland Council's Parking Services, (iv)directed by a Parking Enforcement Officer in uniform or a police officer in uniform.

- (3) Disabled Persons' Parking Places (applicable daily, 24 hrs a day)
 Parking places for disabled persons' vehicles only will be introduced on parts of Marine
 Terrace as identified on the Maps
- (4) Residents Permit Parking Places (applicable daily, 24 hrs a day) Parking places for holders of Residents Permits only will be introduced on parts of Marine Terrace as identified on the Maps

The annual fee payable for a Residents Permit will be £42.00. Further details are available here: https://www.highland.gov.uk/parkingpermits

No prohibition or restriction imposed by the Experimental Order will apply to a vehicle being used in an emergency for ambulance, coastguard, fire brigade or police purposes.

The Council will in due course be considering whether the provisions of the Experimental Order should be made permanent.

Any person may object to the making of a future permanent order within a period of 6 months from the date the Experimental Order comes into force or, if the Experimental Order is varied by a subsequent experimental order or modified pursuant to section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, from the date of that variation or modification comes into force. The Principal Traffic Officer of The Highland Council may, if it appears to him essential in the interests for the expeditious, convenient or safe movement of traffic, or of the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities, or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area, and after such consultation and notice as are required by law, modify or suspend the operation of this Order or any provisions of it in accordance with section 10(2) of the Act of 1984.
