Erosion of the boundaries of the 'Jewel in the Crown' within Lochaber will also importantly impact eventually on the economy of Lochaber which is highly dependent on, outdoor activity and recreational visitors, to the Outdoor Capital of the UK.

Although this area is not a designated National Park Area this should not detract or lessen the environmental importance or scenic value of the area. We urge you, therefore, not to deal with this in a way that would indicate that as a NSA the Ben Nevis and Glen Nevis area is of lesser importance than a NPA and that you do not underestimate the necessity for the strategic preservation and management of the environment of this area and its economic importance to Fort William and Lochaber.
