Project Update -

Kilmallie Rd flood wall

- Riverside erosion control and reinstatement works will be ongoing. Complete
- 9Nr Gully lid replacement @ site entrance. Complete
- Surfacing works on Kilmallie Rd Complete
- Reinstate area @ Wet well Complete
- Construct Grasscrete area @ Wet well Complete
- Construct new planter @ Wet well Complete
- Road Signage install ongoing
- Replacing damaged kerbs & upfilling/Soiling from kerb to wall face ongoing -Complete

Caol foreshore flood embankment.

- Rock armour works to Caol spit are 99% complete.
- Surfcaing Complete
- Landscaping (De-stoning) Bare root Planting November
- Install Fridge + Freezer 31/08/23
- Fencing around Caol Spit ongoing
- Signage install ongoing
- Community Shed Installed, meter installation set at 25/08/23 Sparky's have installed equipment in advance



Community Benefits

- 90% of site personnel reside in the Highlands.
- 65% of site personnel live within 75-mile radius of the site.
- 50% of site personnel are locals (live within a 10-mile radius of the site).
- To date we have employed 2 local labourers, 1 ganger, 2 machine operators and 4 local cleaners all living within 2 miles of the site.
- Adverts in job centre for labourers and machine operators.
- Discussions with the local schools on talks, time capsules and training for secondary pupils. We currently have a work experience pupil on site.
- Donation of shinty equipment to Lochaber High School.
- An alternative design proposal for part of the works has generated benefits including reduced vehicle movements and a financial saving which is allocated to be spent on Community Benefits.
