This report is provided to families and partners to identify our achievements this session. The next steps in our improvement journey are also outlined.

Throughout the year we continuously evaluate what we do and how it makes a difference to our learners. We want to know what is working well for our school community and what needs further improvement.

Our children and young people are actively consulted and involved in this process. We also give staff, parents/carers, and other partners the opportunity to participate in discussions and activities to shape our improvement journey.

When we develop our improvement project, we use key questions at planned review times throughout the session to know how well we are progressing towards achieving these positive outcomes and changes.

An Cala Our context

An Cala provides part time support to young people who are at risk of missing out on their education due to the nature of their individual challenges. We are situated on the West Highland College Campus in Fort William and serve the High Schools of Lochaber. We have capacity to support between 5 and 10 young people normally between \$1 and \$4.

There are currently staffing pressures due to vacancies. We have not had a permanent manager. We now have an acting manager who took up post in August 2022.

We implement the principles of GIRFEC and Curriculum for excellence. We work alongside partner agencies in Education, Health, Skills Development Scotland, Police, Colleges as well as parent/carers, voluntary sector, and employers to ensure that individual needs are met.

An Cala takes a child centred approach we work on the principle of providing a safe and supportive environment in which young people can achieve their potential while planning for their future. We courage an ethos of mutual respect between all staff and young people.

All young people have an individual plan agreed with the school, young person and parents which may include supporting curricular subjects, vocational training, skills for life and work, outdoor learning, and post school transition.

Pupil Voice: what is working well in our school?

Our children and young people identified the following strengths for our school this session:

Feedback from An Cala student's questionnaire September 2022:

- All students said they felt safe and secure at An Cala
- 100% of students reported that at least one staff member knows them well
- All students said they enjoyed being at An Cala
- Almost all students said that staff are good at letting me know how my learning is progressing
- Almost all students say that An Cala helps them to keep themselves safe and healthy
- All students say that staff at An Cala help me when I am having difficulties
- All students say that staff at An Cala tell them when they are doing well
- Most students reported that they are treated fairly at An Cala
- Almost all say, if something is worrying me, An Cala is good at helping sort things out

Improvement Project 1:

Primary focus: School and ELC Leadership

Year of Project: 1

Purpose: <u>Develop good partnerships with schools</u>

Progress and impact:

Content:

- ✓ We constantly monitor the appropriateness of the curriculum for each young person and adjust where necessary, considering the views of the schools, parents and young people. We will improve our practice in this area through discussions at team meetings and in service days. We follow through ideas, suggestions and queries arising in discussion with the young people to encourage them to participate in their own learning; often these give rise to the exploration of a variety of different personal skills.
- ✓ Our programmes and courses are individually tailored to respond to the needs of the young people. Timetabling between An Cala and other agencies (including schools and colleges) supports progression within curriculum areas. Our award programmes are chosen by each pupil and consider their learning style, interests, strengths and skills. The awards encourage independent learning, improving own learning, working with others and problem solving. Young people plan do and review as part of these awards. This ensures relevance, personalisation, choice, challenge and enjoyment. There are links with numeracy, literacy, health/wellbeing and IT. These also promote wider achievement.
- ✓ Our team takes a joined-up approach to improvement in all that it does. All staff are committed to giving the best opportunities An Cala can offer to each young person attending. We are willing to implement change and are sensitive to the effects of different practice. Consistency of approach engenders the trust we need from young people so that they can give us honest and realistic impressions of their thoughts and feelings. While flexibility to meet the need of the group currently attending is paramount, maintaining the staff as a cohesive team remains a key factor. The improvement is shown by increased attendance, achievement and attainment.
- ✓ Evidence
 Contact maintained with families and staff from other agencies, feedback
 discussed, recorded and acted upon if necessary. Satisfaction expressed by
 families for what their children achieve and increased cooperation, where
 necessary, in maintaining consistency of support.

Next steps:

- Promote relationships, develop partnerships with schools to ensure that each young person receives a holistic, individual curriculum.
- An Cala Acting Manager and teachers to liaise closely with schools' subject teachers to support subjects (wherever possible) that young people find too challenging in the school setting.
- Arrange educational visits where appropriate to ensure barriers to transitions are addressed.

Planning Ahead

An Cala evaluation:

Staffing pressures – full time CSW appointed until June 2024, full time PSA appointed until June 2024.

Trips – feedback from student forum:' to start going out on trips again like other students did before Covid.' An Cala, students & staff attended trip to Landmark in June. On going outdoor activities include John Muir Award and Geocaching.

Improvement project 1 (purpose) – develop good partnerships with schools.

- An Cala have raised capacity to support young people from 8 13 young people.
- An Cala have added period 7 to staff and young people's timetable in June.
- An Cala teaching/support staff days as well as times changed to support additional period.
- An Cala is an off-site provision for young people with SEBN learning needs.
- An Cala liaise closely with individual schools/parents re: timetables to meet individual needs.
- Taxi will be used for pupils to travel to/from An Cala & school. Taxi schedules arrange to support individual timetables, to ensure young people transferring to/from their shared placement is maintained for continuity and progression in their learning.
- Our transition have been really positive at all points.
- Reviews are held termly at An Cala attended by school staff, An Cala and parents.
- An Cala emails/phones schools/parents daily and emails weekly update.
- Child plans are held by schools named person unless held by social work.
