THE HIGHLAND COUNCIL (OLD GLENCOE ROAD) (TEMPORARY 40MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2023

The Highland Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 14(1)(b) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf being satisfied that traffic on the road or roads referred to in this Order should be restricted or prohibited because of the likelihood of danger to the public hereby make the following Order:

- 1. This Order may be cited as "The Highland Council (Old Glencoe Road) (Temporary 40mph Speed Limit) Order 2023" and shall come into effect at 0600hrs on 11 December 2023 and will remain in force for a maximum period of 18 months.
- 2. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. While this Order is in force no person shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle on the lengths of road specified in the Schedule annexed and signed as relative to this Order at a speed in excess of 40 miles per hour.
