# Performance Report 2022/23





### Introduction

The Highland Council collects data on a wide range of performance indicators, of these, there are 34 which the Council considers to be Key Performance Indicators (KPIs).

These provide a high-level overview of the Council's overall performance. The 34 indicators were selected as they provide key insights into effective service delivery across the Council's functions and provide a focus for strategic and operational improvement and decision making.

For many of these indicators, the data is collected by all 32 Scottish Councils. The Highland Council's performance can therefore be compared to other all Councils, or those similar to the Highland Council, known as our 'Family Group'.

## Adult Services

### Direct payment of adult social care funding


**7.3%** of adult social care funding was allocated using direct payments or personalised managed budgets in Highland in 2022/23. Our target was 8.7%.



The Scottish average was **8.7%** and for our family group it was **6.1%**.






**52.9%** of people aged 65+ with long term care needs were receiving care at home in Highland in 2022/23. Our target was 61.7%.


## Achievement of Curriculum for Excellence Levels: Literacy



**64.8%** of P1, P4 and P7 pupils combined achieved expected CFE level in literacy.

The Scottish average was **72.7%** and for our family group it was **70.4%**.

Highland is ranked 31st. The target for 2022/23 is 67%.



## Achievement of Curriculum for Excellence Levels: Numeracy



**72.2%** of P1, P4 and P7 pupils combined achieved expected CFE level in numeracy.

The Scottish average was **79.6%** and for our family group it was **77.0%**.

Highland is ranked 31st. The target for 2022/23 is 75%.






### **Pupil destinations**

**94.5%** of Highland pupils entered positive destinations in 2021/22. Our target was 96.5%.

This compares to **95.7%** across Scotland and **95.5%** for our family group.



Highland is ranked **26**<sup>th</sup> in Scotland.



## Children's Services

### Level 5 attainment – all pupils

**67%** of Highland secondary school pupils in 2021/22 achieved 5 or more awards at SCQF level 5 or higher. Our target was 67%.



The average across Scotland was 69%, and for our family group was 68%.

### Level 6 attainment – all pupils

**33**% of Highland secondary school pupils achieved 5 or more awards at SCQF level 6 or higher in 2021/22. Our target was 39%.



### Complementary Average total attainment points

The complementary average tariff points awarded for levels of attainment in 2021/22 in Highland is split into 3 levels, all set against a target of our **virtual comparator**:



Highest attaining 20%: **1257** against a target of 1288.

Middle Attaining 60%: **618** against a target of 631.





Lowest Attaining 20%: **134** against a target of 137.

## Children's Services

### School attendance – All pupils

School attendance rates are calculated every two years.

For 2021-23, the school attendance rate amongst all pupils in Highland was 90.0%. The target set is to match the Scottish Average.

The Scottish average was 90.2% and for our family group it was 90.8%.





### Children accommodated out with Highland

The average number of children and young people accommodated by the Council out with Highland in 2022/23 was 20. Our target for this was 19 children accommodated.



### School attendance – Looked After Children

The latest school attendance rates for looked after children are from 2019-20. This data indicates an attendance rate of **86.9%**. Our target was 86.5%.







## Cultural and Leisure Services

## Cost per attendance at sports facilities

The average Council spend per customer visit to a sports facility in Highland decreased in 2022/23. Our target was £2.98.

The Scottish average was £4.89 and for our family group it was £3.75.

There were 1,821,927 visits to sports facilities in Highland in 2022/23.



### Cost per library visit

The average Council spend per customer visit to a library in Highland in 2022/23. Our target was £2.14.

The Scottish average was £2.81 and for our family group it was £3.24.





Highland is ranked **2<sup>nd</sup>** in Scotland.

There were over **3.5 million visits** to our libraries in 2021/22, including inperson and virtual visits.









## Road Services

### Road maintenance

**36.5%** of the road network in Highland should be considered for maintenance treatment (2022/23).






### Street lighting

**9.2 million kWh** of energy was consumed by our streetlights in 2022/23. Our target was 9.5 million kWh.





## **Environmental Services**

### Street cleanliness

The street cleanliness score for Highland was **96.1%** in 2022/23. Our target was 95%.



The Scottish average was **90.6%** and for our family group it was **92.5%**.



Highland is ranked 5<sup>th</sup> in Scotland.

### Household waste that is recycled

We recycled **37.2%** of household waste in 2022. Our target was 37.0%.

The Scottish average was 43.3% and for our family group it was 37.0%.





We are ranked **26**th in Scotland.

## Re-letting Council houses

The average time to re-let Council homes in 2022/23 was **32.1 days.** 






Our target was for this to be below 35 days.

### Homelessness case duration

The average case duration for someone who is homeless in Highland was **45 weeks** (2022/23). This is down 5 weeks from 21/22.

Our target was to reduce this to 48 weeks.



#### Rent arrears

In Highland, gross rent arrears as a percentage of total rent due was **7.1%** in 2022/23.




Our target was for this to be below 5%.



The Scottish average was **9.6%**. For our family group it was **7.8%**.

### Asset suitability

**77.7%** of Highland Council buildings were suitable for their current use in 2022/23. Our target was 83.1%.

The Scottish average was **86.1%**.

Highland is ranked **16<sup>th</sup>** in Scotland.



The Scottish average was **96.2%**. For our family group it was **96.8%**.

### Regional procurement

**49.1%** of our procurement spend in 2022/23 was with local enterprises. Our target was 36.3%.



Highland is ranked 1st in Scotland.

The Scottish average was **29.6%** and for our family group it was **35.6%**.





**New Claims** 



### Superfast broadband

86% of properties in Highland had access to superfast broadband in 2022/23.

The Scottish average was 96% and for our family group it was 84%.



Our target was for 86% of properties in Highland to have access to superfast broadband by March 2023.
