

Two short, scenic walks to enjoy

Dà chuairt, ghoirid

Pronounced: Da chooarsht ghoreet

As well as the short walk from here to the Glen Loy Aqueduct (please see panel to left for details), there are two other short walks from here for you to enjoy.

Erracht Oakwoods Walk

Cuairt Coille-dharaich an Eireachd

This woodland walk provides scenic views across the Great Glen to Ben Nevis **Beinn Nibheis**. The woods are being managed to allow areas of ancient semi-natural woodland amongst the commercial plantations to expand and regenerate. A path leads down through the woods to the River Loy **Abhainn Laoigh**. To follow this walk, go through the aqueduct and turn right along the single track road. Walkers from Strone **An t-Sròn** will have to walk along the B8004 to reach the start point for the walk.

Difficulty: moderate - waterproof footwear.

Gradient: easy - muscle-loosener.

Distance (from "You are here" point):
4 km (2.5 miles) approx.

Strone Viewpoint Walk

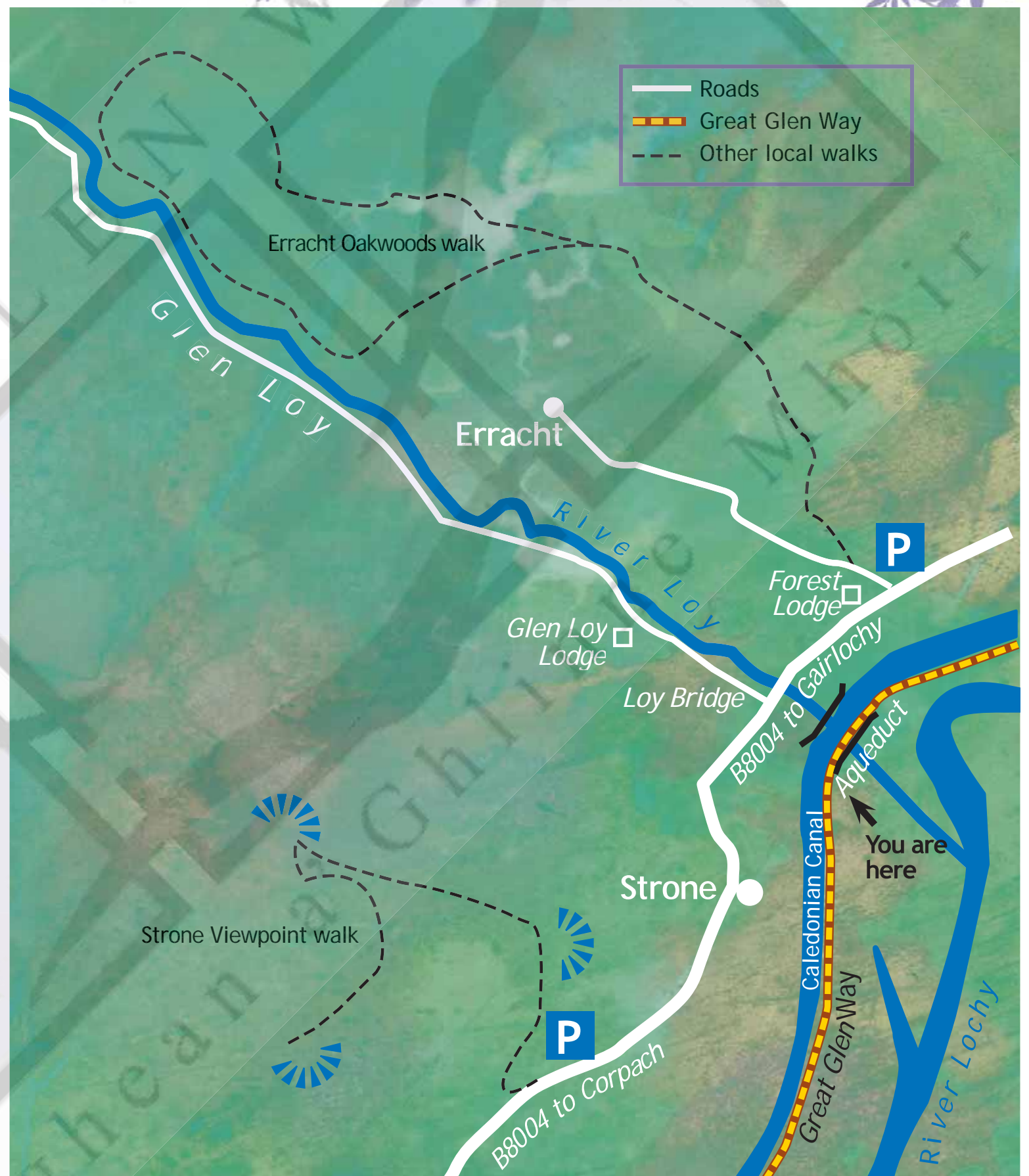
Cuairt na Sròine

An easy walk following a forest road giving fine views up the Great Glen toward Spean Bridge **Drochaid an Aonachain** and down towards Loch Linnhe. This is also one of the few places where you can enjoy a full view of the north face of Ben Nevis and the Grey Corries **Coireachan Liatha**. To follow this walk, go through the aqueduct and turn left along the single track road. Walkers from Strone will have to walk along the B8004 to reach the start point for the walk.

Difficulty: easy - sensible footwear.

Gradient: moderate - muscle-stretcher.

Distance (from "You are here" point):
5 km (3.1 miles) approx.
