

Building on the ethos developed at Milton of Leys - A Highland Pragmatism.

The school is laid out in a simple steading arrangement with two teaching wings off the main spine. These form an open courtyard orientated to provide maximum sun penetration and wind protection.

Construction efficiency and economy was achieved in subtle ways; use of a three metre grid laterally and a common cross section to make use of domestic-scale timber frame construction; and by minimising the external openings to reduce labout costs

We have developed an appropriate design approach to create a family of buildings in the Highlands, which are sympathetic to context, respond to tradition, are sustainable, robust and cost effective. They also delight.
