Policy on the acceptable use of social media

Rules and Guidance (for the Public)

The following statement will be published on all Council social media to set out our policy on acceptable use of these platforms by the public. The statement reads:

"The Highland Council uses <u>Twitter</u>, <u>Facebook</u>, <u>Flickr</u>, <u>YouTube</u> and <u>online</u> <u>blogs</u> to keep people informed about the services that we provide, including the outcomes of committee meetings and other key events like election results.

We may also use online blogs to ask for views and feedback on certain topics such as budget consultations.

Our social media sites are administered by Council staff and are generally monitored during normal office hours. They are not routinely monitored 24/7.

- Do not advertise products or services.
