Prospects

In Strathy the principal landowner is the Scottish Executive. Strathy has a dispersed form determined by its crofting interests with development mainly strung in a linear fashion in three separate strands from the A836. It does not currently have much in the way of local services with Portskerra and Melvich providing this nearby. The Highland Renewable Energy Strategy and Planning Guidelines identifies land south of Strathy and Portskerra/Melvich as a possible area for national and major wind farm development and an application for a wind farm at Strathy forest is currently under consideration.


Development Factors

- Strathy East has no capacity for further housing because of the standard of the road and its junctions with the A836;
- There is a small public drainage network at Steven terrace but due to crofting constraints the adjacent land is not available for development;
- Strathy West can accommodate infill development in addition to the allocation on the common • grazings;
- Strathy Point also has capacity for infill development in accordance with the settlement pattern • but key public views to the coast should be protected;
- Low downward emission design street lights.
