



This Newsletter has been produced by Coffey Construction to communicate with businesses and residents in Inverness who are currently affected by the enabling works of the River Ness Flood Alleviation scheme. The purpose of this bulletin is to give you the final and up to date information regarding our progress to completion in April 2013.

Coffey Construction will complete the enabling works of the River Ness Flood Alleviation scheme as scheduled in April 2013. These works started on Monday 22nd October 2012 with new services being diverted and installed on Bank Street, Friars Street, Friars Lane, Douglas Row, Glebe Street, Riverside Street, Huntly Street, Friars Place and Castle Road. The enabling works required new water mains, gas mains, electricity cables and telecommunications to be re-located as detailed below:-

Bank Street:-
The enabling work on Bank Street commenced on 29th October 2012 and was completed ahead of schedule on the 9th December 2012. Work included the diversion of gas, water, electricity and telecommunication services.



Huntly Street:-
Enabling work on Huntly Street has been carried out in sections to cause as little disruption as possible to businesses and residents in the locality. The bulk of the work on this street has included the decommissioning and installation of new water and gas mains. Huntly Street is due for completion in the next two weeks.

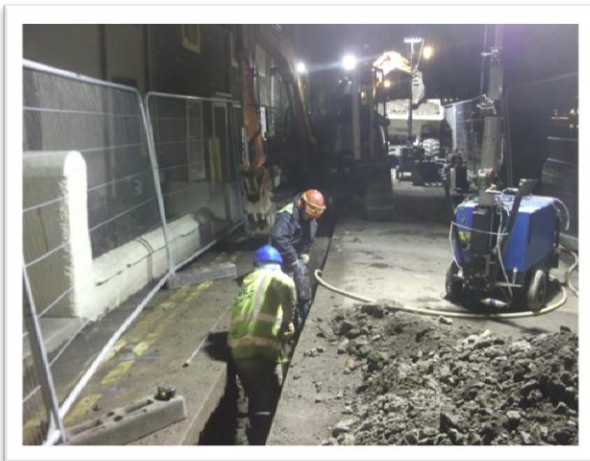


Friars Street/Glebe Street/Riverside Street:-

Installation of SSE cables on Friars Street which continued along Glebe Street up Riverside Street to connect to the power sub-station.

Douglas Row:-

Work on Douglas Row started in January 2013, with the excavation and installation of a new gas main. The road was re-opened to traffic on the 29th of January 2013.
