Information for residents and businesses from The Highland Council, the Scottish Flood Forum and SEPA

WELCOME to our second Flood Bulletin. This occasional bulletin is to keep you informed of developments and work in progress following the July/ August 2011 Inverness Floods.

The past two weeks have seen a very good response with many people using the Flood Drop-in Centre. This will continue to run for the foreseeable future and will provide professional and expert advice on all aspects of helping you get back to your homes as quickly as possible. If you were flooded or have a problem or worry regarding your property come and see us – we are here for you.

Many of the enquiries handled to date have been regarding the Insurance claim process, the role of Loss Adjusters and getting the right builder.

UPDATE FROM TEC SERVICES

The Councils Direct Labour Organisation have continued with regular maintenance operations throughout the areas of Westhill, Culloden and Balloch removing litter, foliage and debris in watercourses and at culverts/ culvert screens.

During and after the heavy storms experienced since mid July, there have significant additional efforts made to deal with flooding of roads and adjacent public and private property. Regular attendance, and call-outs outwith normal working hours has been necessary to deal with flooding, or threatened flooding, caused by blockages to culverts and culvert screens throughout Inverness East. Debris brought down by the

high volumes of water caused particular difficulties in the Tower Burn and Smithton Burn; where significant erosion of silt, gravel and stone created major problems at Resaurie and south of Murray Terrace. Gullies and carrier drains have been cleaned in Murray Road, Place and Terrace, Bremner Gardens and Smithton Villas. The DLO is also liaising with Scottish Water, in an attempt to identify constraints in their surface water systems, in particular the sewers around Bremner Gardens and Smithton Villas.

A FOLLOW-UP PUBLIC MEETING will be held on Thursday 24 November 2011 at Culloden Academy, Inverness, starting at 7:30pm. An update will be given on the work being carried out by the Council's Flood Team and JBA Consulting who have been appointed by the Highland Council to undertake a detailed study of the underlying causes of the flooding. Neil Gillies, Director of TEC Services, will also give an update on the measures which are being considered to reduce the risk of future flooding.

UPDATE FROM JBA CONSULTING

JBA are in the process of assessing the causes of the recent flooding on the Smithton and Culloden Burn West to determine the capacity of the various structures that cross these two watercourses and to make recommendations for future works that will mitigate the risk of flooding.

As part of this study, JBA have reviewed the rainfall data to determine the magnitude of the flooding. Furthermore, you may be aware that







a team of surveyors has been on site to survey the watercourses. This has been carried out to enable JBA to build a model of the watercourses and assist in determining the risk associated with each structure and options to mitigate further flooding. Further modelling and the determination of options will be undertaken prior to reporting and presentation of their findings at the next public meeting.

NEW APPROACH TO MANAGING FLOOD RISK IN SCOTLAND

Scotland has adopted legislation introducing a new approach to how we manage flood risk and aims to reduce the impact of flooding on Scotland's communities. SEPA, local authorities and Scotlish Water are working closely with Scotlish Government to develop co-ordinated plans which will help us tackle flooding more effectively across Scotland.

TIPS FOR DEALING WITH YOUR LOSS ADJUSTER

- Take plenty of photos of both the inside and outside of your property including all the rooms and bathroom now. If its not too late photograph all flood damaged property and effects
- For contents lists use Argos catalogues, the internet or similar to get a price for your personal effects, remember it has to be 'like for like' replacement
- Get full contact details regarding your Loss Adjuster
- Keep all receipts you incur including telephone bills, food, transport you may get help with these
- Keep copies and records of ALL conversations with your Loss Adjuster, start a diary now it could prove to be invaluable if things go wrong, what is said who to, e-mail is a good medium to use
- If you have preferred local builder why not ask him to come along when the

Loss Adjuster draws up the schedule of works or visits. We have details of builders who can repair flooded property – if you can't find one

- Exaggeration may be a temptation but to the Insurance company its fraud and may void your claim and your policy, please don't do it, it's not worth it
- If you're unhappy with anything discuss it first with your Loss Adjuster – if that doesn't resolve things contact Paul Hendy at the drop-in centre.
