Golspie High School Associated School Group Overview

Report by Director of Education, Culture and Sport Service

Summary

This report provides an update of key information in relation to the schools within the Golspie High School Associated School Group (ASG), and provides useful updated links to further information in relation to these schools.

1.0 ASG PROFILE

The primary schools in this area serve over 300 pupils, with the secondary school serving 269 young people. (Appendix 1 provides the primary schools roll break down).

There are currently no acting Head Teachers in this ASG.

1.1 Attainment and Achievement

1.1.1 Golspie HIGH SCHOOL

Attainment – Performance Summary

Significant trends in S4 attainment

Attainment measures for 5+ @Level 5 have moved up in % figures but overall the measures for 5+@level 5 have remained static in NCD 5. Boys' attainment is particularly poor but girls' results are also weak this year.

The attainment at level 3 is significantly down on last year taking the school from NCD 4 to NCD 7 in English and Maths, the lowest NCD placing for five years. Attainment at Level 4 is also well down.

Apart from 5+' level 5 these are the weakest results for the last five years: however, for 5+@ level 5, the results are the best against comparator schools for the last five years. All Skills for Work course have satisfactory passes.

Significant trends in S5 attainment

The attainment of S5 pupils is declining for all measures apart from 3+@ level 6 and 5+@ level 6.

The attainment of S5 girls is poor at lower levels but improves after 5+@ level 4. The attainment of S5 boys is static with the exception of 5+ @ level 6 which shows a marked improvement and is a super result.

Conversely S5 performance against comparator schools is the best for the last 4 years.

Significant trends in S6 attainment

Attainment in S6 is improved at lower levels but poor beyond 5+@ level 3. Girls performance is stronger than boys with some pleasing improvements in NCD placing. Boys preform slightly better up to 5+ level 4.

Against comparator schools S6 perform well at Eng. & Maths level 3, these are the best results in the last 5 years, but then perform poorly against comparator schools in remaining measures.

Three Year National Priority Measures;

- Results are declining or static from 5+ level 4 upwards
- Improvement in Eng. & Maths @ level 3(best result since 2007-9) and 5+ level 3
- Decline at higher levels to lowest or equal lowest NCDs since 2007-9

Suggested Actions

- Renewed rigour and transparency needs to be brought to whole school, systematic tracking and accurate target setting based on all available data.
- Presentation policy must be reviewed to avoid the level of incompletes and no awards in almost all presentations.
- Presentation must be based on tracking, involve pupils and parents and be flexible to move pupils both up and down award levels based on performance
- The school needs to explore ways in which tracking information, Summary of Personal Progress (SPP) and AfE, from Primary Schools can be shared with and made use of by all Departments

School staff information from Staff Census collected Sept 2013. Please note that only certain types of teaching posts are counted here: Normal complement, Long term sick absence replacement, secondment replacement, maternity leave replacement, other replacement, temporary contract, covering a vacancy. Teachers who teach at the school but are centrally employed are excluded.

Core staffing is calculated using the Highland Staffing Model, which takes account of national agreements for P1 to P3 class sizes. As a result, all primaries in this ASG are staffed according to the model.
