### Disabled Persons' Parking Places (Scotland) Act 2009 – Annual Report 2012/13

### Report by Director of Transport, Environmental and Community Services

### Summary

This report invites Members to approve the Council's Annual Report to the Scottish Government in accordance with the Disabled Persons' Parking Places (Scotland) Act 2009.

### 1. Background

- 1.1 The Disabled Persons' Parking Places (Scotland) Act 2009 was introduced through a private Member's Bill.
- 1.2 The main policy objective of the Bill was to prevent parking spaces designated for disabled persons' being occupied by those who are not entitled to use them and thus ensuring that enforcement action under the Act can be taken in the case of any contravention.
- 1.3 At the TEC Services Committee on 24 September 2009 it was agreed that the Council will commence to implement its duties under the Act within existing resources.
- 1.4 The Act required that each Local Authority prepares an annual report on its performance in relation to the Act and that this is report is published. The Annual Report on the Council's performance under the Act as submitted to the Scottish Government is contained in **Appendix A**.

### 2. Implementation of the Act

- 2.1 The preparation of the Road Traffic Orders is being carried out on a priority basis as set out below:
  - 1. On-street
  - 2. Off-street for Council controlled Car Parks
  - 3. Private car parks with the permission of the owner / tenant.
- 2.2 Road Traffic Orders have been issued and made for both Skye and Lochalsh, Caithness and Lochaber and these along with on-site signing are in place and operational.

- 2.3 In Sutherland and Easter Ross, Ross-shire and Inverness the consultation process has been successfully completed and implementation of the Road Traffic Order will be made when all the signing and site works are complete.
- 2.4 The final area is Nairn Badenoch and Strathspey and the proposals have been presented to Members for their observations, and the Road Traffic Order is being prepared.
- 2.5 The work to identify disabled bays in all off-street car parks is on-going and will be progressed in due course.
- 2.6 In regards to private area car parks, letters have been issued to business owners throughout the Council area and returns have been received from a significant number. However there has only been a small uptake on the offer to formalise disabled parking at their premises.
- 2.7 All of these Road Traffic Orders have been incorporated in the Council's WDM asset management system to aid future management and maintenance.

### 3. Implications

- 3.1 No additional resources have been provided to carry out this work and the implementation is dependent on funding being found from existing budget allocations.
- 3.2 The disabled parking bays are supported by Road Traffic Orders.
- 3.3 This work will support disabled drivers.
- 3.4 There are no climate change implications arising from this report.
- 3.5 There are no risk implications arising from this report.

#### 4. Recommendation

4.1 Members are asked to approve the Council's Annual Report in relation to the Disabled Persons' Parking Places (Scotland) Act 2009, as contained in **Appendix A**.
