Application for a Provisional Premises Licence under the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005

Ardgay Stores and Highland Café, Main Street, Ardgay, IV24 3DJ

Report by the Clerk of the Licensing Board

Summary

This Report relates to an application for a Provisional Premises Licence for Ardgay Stores and Highland Café, Main Street, Ardgay, IV24 3DJ

1.0 Background

- 1.1 Ardgay Stores and Highland Café is a single storey convenience store and café in detached purpose-built premises adjacent to the A836 Main Street, Ardgay.
- 1.2 On 30 October 2013 the Licensing Board received an application for the provisional grant of a Premises Licence from the partnership of Ardgay Stores and Highland Cafe in respect of Ardgay Stores and Highland Cafe.
- 1.3 The application was publicised during the period 6 December to 27 December 2013.
- 1.4 In accordance with standard procedure, Police Scotland, Scottish Fire & Rescue Service, the Council's TEC Services (Environmental Health) and Planning and Building Standards were consulted on the application.

Notification of the application was also sent to NHS Highland and to the local Community Council.

- 1.5 No objections or representations have been received from these agencies.
- 1.6 A representation in support of the application dated 12 December 2013 has been received from Mr & Mrs Paul and Victoria Whittock and is attached to this Report.
- 1.7 The applicant and supporters has been invited to attend the meeting.

2.0 Legislation

2.1 The Licensing Board must in considering and determining the application, consider whether any grounds of refusal apply and if none of them applies, the Board must grant the application.

Relevant grounds of refusal may be: -

- 1. the premises are excluded premises;
- 2. the grant of the application will be inconsistent with one or more of the licensing objectives; having regard to;

(i) the nature of the activities proposed to be carried on in the subject premises, (ii) the location character and condition of the premises, and (iii) the persons likely to frequent the premises, if the Board considers the premises are unsuitable for the sale of alcohol.

- 3. having regard to the number and capacity of licensed premises of the same or similar description in the locality, the Board considers that if the application were to be granted, there would, as a result, be over provision of licensed premises of that description in the locality.
- 2.2 The Board has power where, if they would refuse the application as made, but if a modification is proposed by them and accepted by the applicant, the application can be granted as modified.

3.0 Summary of Application

The applicants seek the following on-sale hours:-

Monday to Sunday: 1100 hours to 2400 hours

The applicants seek the following off-sale hours:-

Monday to Sunday: 1000 hours to 2200 hours

4.0 Policies

5.0 Licensing Standards Officer

The LSO has provided the following comments:-

5.1 The applicant seeks to operate a small convenience store with integral café within a single storey new-build development on the site of the former filling station alongside the A836 in Ardgay, Sutherland.

- 5.2 The application is for both on and off-sales. There is no bar counter on the premises and the café element of the business will be serviced from the main counter.
- 5.3 The proposed alcohol capacity of 19.8 m² falls below the threshold of 40 m² in terms of the Highland Licensing Board overprovision policy statement.
- 5.4 The applicant initially sought a customer capacity of 25 persons for the café area but now seeks to amend that capacity and reduce it to 20 persons in accordance with comments from Building Standards.
- 5.5 The licensed hours applied for are within policy for both on and off-sales premises and the activities or services to be provided are appropriate for the specified operation.

6.0 Conditions

6.1 Mandatory Conditions

If the application is approved the Mandatory Conditions set out in Schedule 3 of the Act will apply.

6.2 Local Conditions

None to apply
