1. Introduction

The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting and clarified that the meeting would focus on taking forward the action plans being developed by the workgroups.

2. Apologies

3. Minute of Previous Meeting on 1 March 2013

Viven Roden requested a change be made Margaret Saunders was representing Inverness area CC Forum and not Strathdearn CC

4. Matters Arising from meeting of 1 March 2013

Cllr Prag was concerned that actions outstanding from previous meetings especially marketing would still be completed and not forgotten about. The Chair advised that this would not be the case that all outstanding actions would be completed.

5. Workgroup Feedback on Progress

Members broke into two groups to discuss the progress so far of the Workgroups.

1. Vision, Strategy and Action Plan / City Centre Group

Scott Armstrong the lead officer for the Vision, Strategy and Action Plan Group explained that they had broken it in five sections.

Active City Natural City Cultural City Gastronome City Welcome City

Ideas should be aimed at locals because if something is appealing to locals tourists will use it too.

The top priorities that they consider are Cycling in the Active City section and Welcome City.

The Vision, strategy and Action Plan group is very closely linked with the City Centre Group who agreed that 'Welcome' is of a high priority along with marketing and training.

2. UHI Campus – maximising Benefits – Action Plan

It was **NOTED** that the workgroup will be meeting in early June.

3. Employability / Hospitality

The work group was tasked with working on the key themes of 'employment and tackling unemployment' and 'employability / hospitality'.

The definition of Employability is about people being capable of getting and keeping work. For the individual, employability depends on the knowledge, skills and attitudes they possess. Employability is the capability to move into the labour market to realise potential through sustainable and accessible employment.

Employment means full or part-time paid work, including self-employment.

There are a number of statutory agencies, third sector organisations and partnerships (e.g. Highland Works, Inverness Employability Group and the Tourism and Hospitality Working Group) already actively working in the employability / employment arena, delivering a range of service provision. Highland Opportunity, Business Gateway and HIE play key roles in stimulating and attracting business growth to create jobs.

This working group will seek to provide clarity around what currently exists, thus avoiding any duplication.

It was **AGREED** that this work group be renamed the 'Employment and Employability Support Working Group'

It was **AGREED to** identify the following as priority projects

- I. Cycling / Walking Healthy Travel
- II. Welcome City
- III. Employability
