Inverness Common Good Fund Grant and Capital Projects

Report by the Inverness City Manager

Summary

This report sets out the current applications for grant funding to be determined and the current status of capital projects.

1. Grants and Capital Projects

- 1.1 The current summary of funds available following the Grants Sub-Committee meeting on 30 September 2013 is set out in **Appendix 1**.
- 1.2 **Booklet A** includes details of current grant applications for more than £10,000. Members are invited to consider the applications. Members may wish to consider the comments made at the Grants Sub-Committee.
- 1.3 Grant applications between £10,000 and £30,000 are listed in the Minute. Approval of the Minute will confirm approval or otherwise of the applications listed. In the event of the Committee agreeing to defer any of these applications, a report will be presented to the next appropriate CIAC, with full details of the relevant application(s).
- 1.4 In order for applications to be competent they must principally benefit the inhabitants of the (former) Burgh of Inverness.
- 1.5 **Appendix 2** details the current status of capital projects.

Capital Projects Funded by Inverness Common Good Fund

1 General

1.1 This appendix provides project status information for current key capital projects funded by the Inverness Common Good Fund, including financial progress details, as at 4 October 2013.

2 Capital Programme Update

2.1 The current status of each individual project is summarised below.

2.2 Restoration of Inverness Steeple

- 2.2.1 The contract was completed on the 22 March 2013 and the defects liability period will end on the 21 March 2014.
- 2.2.2 The final account has been agreed.

Agreed Budget £550,000 Final Account £520,000

2.3 Replacement of Gas Boilers; Inverness Town House

- 2.3.1 The contract was completed on the 4 October 2013 and the defects liability period will end on the 3 October 2014.
- 2.3.2 The final account has still to be agreed.

Agreed Budget £225,000 Anticipated Final Account £225,000

2.4 Conservation of External Fabric, Town House, Inverness

2.4.1 The project is currently on programme and the final reports and revised budget costs have been completed and ready to report.

It has been agreed that the report will be taken to a members briefing session before going to the City of Inverness Area Committee.

Estimated Budget £4,000,000

2.5 Replacement of High Level Windows, Market Arcade, Victorian Market

2.5.1 An Architect has been appointed and the initial surveys have taken place. A Listed Building Application will be submitted August 2013. It is anticipated that the Listed Building Application will not be agreed until Oct/Nov 2013. We would recommend the works do not commence on site until Jan 2014 and completed before the end of Mar 2014.

Agreed Budget £70,000

2.6 Internal Re-painting, Market Arcade, Victorian Market

2.6.1 Listed Building Application has been submitted. It is anticipated that the work will commence Jan 2014 and be completed by Feb 2014.

Agreed Budget

2.7 Refurbishment 1-5 Church Street, Inverness

- 2.7.1 Approval to proceed was granted at the City of Inverness Area Committee on 12 August 2013. The Committee agreed to proceed with Option 4 at a cost of £947K, discussion also took place about the additional add-on option to upgrade the existing front elevation at an additional cost of £120K. The add-on option was not formally agreed at the last meeting. In consequence the Committee is invited to agree the add-on option as detailed above at an extra cost of £120K, to be drawn from revenue reserves held within the Inverness Common Good Fund

2.8 Town House Car Park, Barrier Alterations

- 2.8.1 Following on from the implementation of the service efficiency proposals which will result in a saving of approximately £20,000 without loss to the permanent staffing establishment. Committee approval is sought for the works to the car park barrier arrangements totalling £11,000. This will be drawn from revenue reserves.
- 2.8.2 The works will involve the alterations to the car park barrier induction loops, installation of CCTV cameras from barriers to two locations in the Town House. Fob key exit control point to be installed.

3. Governance

3.1 These projects are funded by the Inverness Common Good Fund and monthly Contract Monitoring reports will be issued to the Inverness City Manager, in line with governance arrangements.
