3	Integrated Teams Update	MF outlined progress to date on Integrated Teams. The structure was in place and people were now being matched to positions		
4	Early Years Collaborative	The aim is to make Scotland the best place in the world for children to grow up.  Collaborative in the sense that all areas of Scotland will share good practice to achieve improvements. Three main aims 1) reduce stillbirth and infant mortality by 15% 2) 90% of children to reach expected developmental milestones by 30 months 3) 90% of children to reach expected milestones by the time they start primary school. Workstreams have been formed and an organisational structure is being developed for Highland.  Number of children taken into care is rising but this is partly due to more robust assessment criteria. 5	Family Teams Development	The Family Teams model has a unified group of professional working across multiple ranges of services, engaging with parents at the earliest opportunity. There is an enhanced preventative approach promoting attachment. The workforce must be confident with clear roles under a strong and effective single management structure. Support for the family can be better achieved through improved linkage with other critical services/systems	AL	1 NOV 2013
6	Family Nurse Partnership FNP	FNP is a licensed home visiting programme for first time teenage mums. Begins at the twelfth week of pregnancy continuing till the child is two. Weekly or fortnightly visits by named family nurse. Aims to improve the health and wellbeing of parents and children. Due to programme criteria only available in more populous areas ie Inverness. If family should move from Inverness service will continue to be delivered for them in other parts of Highland		
7	Dental School Visiting Service	Although children's dental health is improving in the Highlands, evidence exists that levels of registration amongst some younger children remains low. Mobile dental clinics are an effective means of delivering dental care for children who have not visited a dentist before. NHS Highlands provision has no universally applied criteria resulting in considerable variations across schools. The future provision of mobile dental clinics will be targeted at schools where most benefit could be achieved. Children in other schools will be encouraged to register at nearby clinics.
