		requirement will be dealt with by block recruitment and block interviewing. Qualified early			
		years practitioners will be placed at HC5, an increase from HC3 which is the current pay			
		grade. Various models of delivery have been discussed with nursery staff and head			
		teachers. Voluntary centres have all agreed in principle. There has been no discussion to			
		date with private day care centres. Two models of delivery have been considered the			
		favoured option being extending morning and afternoon sessions to 3 hours 10 minutes			
		each staffed by dedicated teams.
