Every vehicle in the Inverness area was low level accessible and within one year they hope to have the whole fleet the same. Every driver is trained on how to raise and lower the ramps. They have a designated disability help line which disabled people can use so that drivers are informed that they may require help.			
		Gillian McCreath informed the meeting of a survey which has recently been carried out with the taxi drivers in Inverness to gain more information regarding the accessibility of taxis. 33 licenced taxis and 9 private hire vehicles are currently accessible.
