Performance against the Highland Interim Local Policing Plan 2013-14

Report by the Highland Local Policing Commander - Chief Superintendent Julian Innes

Summary

To provide an update to Committee Members on the progress with reference to the objectives outlined in the Highland 2013-14 Policing Plan.

1. Background

- 1.1 <u>Performance</u>. Performance is being maintained within the Highland Area and overall crime continues to fall with a drop of 272 Class 1-4 crimes as at 9 March 2014 (6178 crimes last year to date and 5960 crimes this year to date¹). There has been a 30.3% drop in Class 1 violent crimes (such as murder, attempted murder and serious assaults) from the previous year (from 317 last year to date and 221 this year to date). There also continues to be a reduction in antisocial behaviour incidents being recorded, with 2306 less incidents recorded up until the 28 February from the same period last year. This equates to a 15.3% drop in antisocial behaviour incidents.
- 1.2 A summary of the current performance against the 2013/14 Highland Policing Plan objectives is at Appendix 1. The period covered by the report is as at 28 February 2014 unless stated otherwise.
- 1.3 <u>CPE Road Policing Paper 5 December 2013 Follow Up.</u> A commitment was made to provide the Committee with information on accidents, involving pedal cyclists, at a future meeting. There were 5 fatal pedal cycle collisions between 2009-2013; the outline details are as follow:
- 1.3.1 There were no fatal collisions in 2009, 2001 and 2012.
- 1.3.2 Five of the 4 cyclists were not wearing a cycle helmet
- 1.3.3 In 3 of the 5 cases the fault was attributed to the cyclist
- 1.3.4 In 2 of the 5 cases there was no involvement of another vehicle.
