- Creative Writing in Schools Programme took place during September.
 Author D S Murray visited and led creative writing session in schools where
 Gaelic is being taught in both Primary and Secondary from Acharacle in the
 south to Farr in the north, this was a very successful programme and plans
 are in place to develop the second phase, which will include a "home-coming"
 theme.
- **Daily Record Gaelic Awards** A number of groups have been nominated from the Highland Council area.

 - In the Arts and Culture category 'Eun Beag Chanaidh/National Theatre a Blas Production
 - In the Learner category Cròileagan Inbhir Theòrsa (Thurso Play Group) In the Innovation in Education category Bun-sgoil Ghàidhlig Inbhir Nis.

The booklet has been produced as part of the Year of Natural Scotland 2013 celebrations and received additional funding from Soillse.

- Taigh na Gàidhlig Mhealanais, We are supporting the Gaelic promotion group, Taigh na Gàidhlig Mhealanais, centred on Melness, in marking the 300th anniversary of the birth of the bard of Durness, Rob Donn Mackay. This entails a special show of his songs and associated music.
- Fèisgoil A number of schools in the Ft William and Thurso will be participating in Fèisgoil pilots commencing in January 2014.
- **Glencanisp, Lochinver Area** Adult Learner Weekend, Comhlan Gàidhlig Asainte, in partnership with the Council are organising an adult learning weekend at Glencanisp Lodge, Lochinver on the 16th and 17th November.
 - **3 Adult Learners Courses are being offered** beginners to advanced levels. An informal ceilidh and finger buffet is being held on the 17th between 18.00hrs 19.00hrs.
- **Tutor Training Course** This was delivered by Ruairidh MacLean for tutors of Adult Gaelic Classes, 13 Tutors attended.
- Christmas Fun Day Fort William, to promote Gaelic Medium Education, this is a community based event
- Gaelic Learners Weekend in the Badenoch Area at Badaguish Out-Door Centre in partnership with SINNE.
- Sgioba Drama Òigridh Inbhir Nis is again taking part in the National Theatre, Connections Festival which will be held in Eden Court 14th -16th April. They will perform a specially commissioned play for the Festival written in English by Pauline McLynn (of father Ted and Shameless fame) which has been translated into Gaelic by Ruairidh Nicolson.
