#### 1 General

1.1 This appendix provides project status information for current key capital projects funded by the Inverness Common Good Fund, including financial progress details, as of 20 August 2014.

#### 2 Capital Programme Update

2.1 The current status of each individual project is summarised below.

#### 2.3 Replacement of Gas Boilers; Inverness Town House

2.3.1 The contract was completed on the 4 October 2013 and the defects liability period will end on the 3 October 2014. The over spend is due to the existing gas main to the kitchen being upgraded.

The budget for 2014/15 is £9,000.

2.3.2 The final account has been agreed.

#### 2.4 Conservation of External Fabric, Town House, Inverness

2.4.1 The project is currently on programme and will be issued for tender Autumn 2014.

After tenders have been returned a full report will be brought back to the December Committee.

#### 2.5 Replacement of High Level Windows, Market Arcade, Victorian Market

2.5.1 The project is currently on programme and due for completion 30 May 2014.

The budget for 2014/15 is £42,000

#### 2.7 Refurbishment 1-5 Church Street, Inverness

2.7.1 The project is currently ready to go out to tender but await confirmation from the client to proceed.
