## 14/04293/PAN: FORCE 9 ENERGY PARTNERS LLP AND EDF ENERGY ER LAND 9KM WEST OF DRUMNADROCHIT, NORTH OF LOCH MEIKLIE

## **Report by Head of Planning and Building Standards**

## **Proposal of Application Notice**

**Description :** Formation of a wind farm including the erection of up to 17 turbines (up to 126.5m to blade tip, access tracks and other ancillary development. The development is to be known as Cnoc an Eas Wind Farm.

Ward : 13 - Aird and Loch Ness

## 1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 To inform the Planning Applications Committee of the submission of the attached Proposal of Application Notice (PAN).
- 1.2 The submission of the PAN accords with the provisions of the Planning etc. (Scotland) Act 2006 and was lodged on 13<sup>th</sup> November 2014. Members are asked to note this may form the basis of a subsequent planning application.
- 1.3 The following information was submitted in support of the Proposal of Application Notice:
  - Site Location Plan; and
    - Application Notice which includes:
      - Description of development;
      - Details of proposed consultation; and
      - Details of any other consultation methods.

## 2.0 DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED DEVELOPMENT

- 2.1 Based upon the information provided, the development is likely to comprise of the following:
  - Up to 17 wind turbines of up to 126.5m tip-height;
  - Access tracks;
  - Turbine foundations and transformer plinths and enclosures;
  - Electrical substation' underground power cable;
  - Borrow pits;

- Permanent anemometer mast; and
- Temporary site construction compound.

# 3.0 SITE DESCRIPTION

- 3.1 The site lies approximately 9km to the west of Drumnadrochit and approximately 1.75km to the north west of Balnain. The site extends to approximately 662 hectares, although the built development will occupy a much smaller area. The turbines will be set on a site which is currently a mix of rocky moorland and coniferous forestry. The highest point on the site is 430m AOD with the turbines sitting at elevations of between 240m AOD and 425m AOD.
- 3.2 The site will be accessed from the A831 road which connects to the A82(T). The site access will be in the vicinity of Kilmartin Farm.
- 3.3 There are a number of sites designated for natural heritage interests in the wider area. The closest designated sites are the Glen Affric Strathconon and North Inverness Lochs Special Protection Areas.
- 3.4 There are a number of scheduled monuments in the area, including but not limited to the following:
  - Achratagan Hut Circle and Cairns (Index no. 11456);
  - Corriemony Chambered Cairn (Index no. 90081); and
  - Urquhart Castle (Index no. 90309).
- 3.5 In addition to the above there are a number of listed buildings and archaeological records, identified within the Highland Historic Environment Record, which exist within and in proximity to the site.
- 3.6 The site contains a number of watercourses which feed into Loch Meiklie and the Camault Burn.
- 3.7 The site is not located within any international or regional landscape designations. However, it is in close proximity of a number of features, including but not limited to, the Glen Strathfarrar and Glen Affric National Scenic Areas, Loch Ness and Duntelchaig and Monar - Mullardoch Special Landscape Areas. In addition there are a number of Gardens and Designed Landscapes in the vicinity of the site.
- 3.8 While not located within a Wild Land Area, the study area of the site will contain some parts of Wild Land Areas, namely:
  - Wild Land Area 20 Monadhliath
  - Wild Land Area 24 Central Highland
- 3.8 When assessing a wind farm proposal consideration of similar developments around the site is required. The list below sets out the projects around this development site that are operational, approved or have been submitted but not yet determined.
