Gairloch High School Associated School Group Overview

Report by Director of Care and Learning

Summary

This report provides an update of key information in relation to the schools within the Gairloch High School Associated School Group (ASG), and provides useful updated links to further information in relation to these schools.

1.0 ASG PROFILE

The primary schools in this area serve over 140 pupils, with the secondary school serving 142 young people.

Gairloch and Poolewe Primary Schools are served by a Cluster Head Teacher, with a Head Teacher post at Bualnaluib, Kinlochewe and Shieldaig Primary Schools. Schools are in receipt of support through the Quality Improvement Manager, Additional Support Needs Manager and the Children's Services Manager.

1.1 Attainment and Achievement

1.1.1 Gairloch High School

Attainment – Performance Summary

As a consequence of the STACs data no longer being produced, no performance data can be provided at this stage.

A separate report using the new "**Insight**" data will be provided to Members when it is available(Summer 2015). This report will cover all the West Area ASGs in a single report, and will enable Members to assess performance across schools and also with the comparator schools.

1.1.2 Wider Achievement and Notable Successes

Secondary – Gairloch High School

Successes

 The school continues to develop efforts to win the Rolls-Royce Science Prize 2015 as the only Scottish representative of 9 UK finalists. The competition ends in May with submissions from the school and a film crew from Rolls-Royce is visiting the school on 29 April.

- **Eclipse** / **Rolls-Royce Science Day** Gairloch pupils held a science day on Friday 20th March and recorded the 2015 eclipse through a partnership with Rolls Royce, the University of Reading and the BBC.
- Comenius Project Ends in April with representatives of seven partner schools from Latvia, Poland, Finland, Spain, Portugal, Greece and Turkey visiting Gairloch. Strong international links with a school in Malawi continue to develop with 2 teachers and 4 pupils being sponsored to visit Gairloch in August. Pupils and staff from Gairloch have already visited each of the partner countries over the last two years
- S1 Bring and Buy Sale In March the school held an S1 Bring and Buy Sale to raise money for a trip to the Cairngorms to enable all to attend. The sale was very successful and we raised £2,170 in total.
- GOLD Duke of Edinburgh Award An S6 pupil completed her Gold Duke of Edinburgh Award.
- Field trips to Dundee and Edinburgh Travel and Tourism and Geography Course work students have engaged on field trips to add context to the work they do in Gairloch.
- **BBC Alba interview** The Gairloch Museum Gaelic short film entry in which three pupils were involved recently made the FilmG competition's shortlist.
- Higher Geography involved in Local Planning As part of their consultation process for the West Highlands and Islands Local Development plan, Lynn Clarke and Carrie Pratt from the Highland Council's Development and Infrastructure Service visited Higher Geography pupils to hear their vision for Gairloch and the surrounding area.
- Game inspires national competition success- A Gairloch High School Young Ambassador, was recently crowned runner-up in a National Obesity Awareness Week (NOAW) competition, winning £1,000 funding to go towards school sports equipment.
- Helping local Mountain Rescue Team As in previous years the school was delighted to provide all of the catering (sourced, prepared and provided by the pupils in the Professional Cookery class) for the recent Torridon MRT training weekend in Lochaber.
- Scottish Indoor Rowing Championships –Three (S2) pupils and two (S3) pupils have been training after school on Tuesday with their trainer for several weeks in preparation for the Scottish Indoor Rowing Competition in Glasgow.
- In the individual races on Friday 5th December a pupil gained silver and a bronze medal, with all five girls achieving personal bests in their races. In the team event for their age category, the girls beat seven other schools to become S3 Scottish Schools Indoor Rowing Champions.
- On Saturday 6 December the girls raced against the established rowing clubs. Yet
 again they won their race, this time against a combined team from five rowing clubs
 from all over Scotland to become Junior 14 Scottish Indoor Rowing Champions. A pupil
 also won a silver medal in the J14, 4-minute individual race adding to the two medals
 already won. A great success for the girls achieving 3 medals, 5 personal bests and 2
 trophies.

Bualnaluib Primary

Successes

- Achieved notable success in Cross Country and Athletics. Cross Country ASG held in Gairloch in May 2014. Pupils won 5 medals out of a possible 20 for the whole race. A notable achievement for a school of 21 pupils.
- Pupils also did well in Athletics at the ASG sports held in Gairloch in June 2014.
- School is recognised for drama and was put on a play in June 2014 entitled "Gift of the Nile", which was written by the pupils and based on a study topic on the Egyptians.
- Pupils also achieved success at the local Mod held in Poolewe in September 2014 there were firsts for Poetry, second for Action song and second for boys singing solo by from a P5 pupil.

Extra Curricular

- Basketball, Football, Curling, Badminton and Shinty
- Badminton is offered to P4-7 once weekly and has a 70% attendance.
- Variety sports club is once fortnightly and is offered to P1-7 and has 90% attendance.

Gairloch Primary

Successes

- Local and National success in the Mod.
- Gaelic Medium children involved in a drama/animation supported by Eden Court, which was filmed.
- Gaelic Medium children took part in Dè-a-nis.
- Pupil Council successfully raised funds for the Red Cross Ebola Appeal and MacMillan cancer.
- In the ASG cross country 5 children took top 10 places.
- The whole school took part in events organised through the Festival of Museums which focussed on weddings.
- National Obesity Awareness Week held a competition to invent a game. The game entered by an ex-pupil in this competition and which won was invented by Primary 4/5.
- P6-7 English class won the 'Magic Moment' Trophy for their 'ladies in waiting,' scene, and the Highland Award: David Nelson Trophy for the highest marks in Junior Section for their performance of Macbeth at the South West Ross Youth Drama Festival in Plockton on Tuesday 3 March.

- Staff raised about £1300 for RNLI, MCAI, School funds and Local swimming pool.
- The boys P5-7 team came 3rd place, within their section, in the Ross-shire Cross Country Championships in Alness on Friday 6 March. Eoin Cumming, Gairloch Primary 7, came 4th in the boys competition overall.
- Various children from the school supported Gairloch Golf Club, and were nominated for RBS Golf Coaching Award. The children were on television and media in support of this award.
- Gairloch Primary won the ASG Loch Ewe Football Shield against various other schools in the area.

Extra Curricular

- Athletics 77% of P1-3 pupils attend.
- Table Tennis 23% pupils attend.
- Animation club 37% of children attend.

Kinlochewe Primary

Successes

- Nursery children have shared experiences with another setting to broaden their social skills and enable them to play with a bigger group of children, this included visiting a Day Care Centre for elderly people and a chance to interact with a different age group of people.
- A P1 child won 1st prize in a "Frozen" art competition within the ASG.
- A P6 child won 1st Prize in a "Paint your Mum for Mother's Day" art competition (age 10-12 category) run by the Eastgate Shopping Centre, Inverness. There were 750 entries and all children had their work displayed in the centre.
- A P6 child came in as 1st Senior girl in a local ASG Cross Country Race.
- Two P6 girls achieved personal bests in the Ross-shire Primary Schools Cross Country Race held in Alness.
- School cleaner achieved a Gold Loo Award for keeping the toilets spotless one of only 2 awarded to primary schools.
- Run a lunchtime vegetable challenge award scheme with more children than ever before participating and eating their daily vegetables.
- School has participated in all Walk to Schools Weeks and The Big Pedal. The children have been enthusiastic and determined to do well and achieve a good ranking.
- All children participated last summer in a 2 night residential trip to Abernethy in the Cairngorms – parental fund-raising supporting the school trip.
- Participated in fund-raising events such as Children in Need and Comic Relief. Also raised money for the Highland Hospice.
- Continued engagement with sustainable education and taken part in the Big Schools Bird Watch, organised a Village Clean-up, participated in a Salmon in the Classroom Project and continued involvement with the RSPB and sea-eagles.
- Participated in the BLAS Festival and invited an outreach worker in drama into school.
- Joined local community each term and supported the Lunch Club.

- Continued links with a school in Malawi. The children really enjoy receiving letters and writing to their pen pals. They like to hear how the orchard they sponsored is progressing. Regular updates through Gairloch High School.
- Arranged re-enactment days, visits to museums etc. to support our learning and continued to use local outdoor environment to help learning.

Poolewe Primary

Successes

- Success in the local Mod, the P5-7 choir came 1st and P1-4 were 1st in the action song. Individuals did very well taking 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in the 3D art, doing well in duet, piping and fiddle
- In November 2014 celebrated the 50th Anniversary of the school opening in the present building. Parents and the community were invited to: photographic displays, playground games from the 60s and 70s, bulb planting, crafts, coin collection for Children 1st, refreshments was served and songs through the decades performed to the audience and the unveiling of a bench.
- Pedometer Challenge supported the children to improve fitness and work on sportsmanship.
- Continued support and participation in the Malawi Project run by the High School.
 Children write to children in Malawi.
- In the Seashore Competition run by Highland Council Biodiversity Officer received a 2nd and a 3rd place plus a number of children were highly commended.
- Participation in the ASG Football tournament, coming second overall
- Attendance on trips out of school including a visit for the P5-7 to the Scottish Ballet and for P1-4 to the panto.
- Evening of plays 'Mr Skellybones' and 'The Emerald Crown' for parents and the community. Donation taken for The Cool Earth Rainforest Charity.
- Pupil Council have raised funds to buy their own goals, build a friendship sign and support charity— the most recent being £140.20 for Comic Relief.

Extra -Curricular

- Walking Club March October 16% of children attended.
- Gardening Club 6 children at a time on a rotation basis 50% of children took part.
- Jog Scotland Club March October 70% of children took part.

Shieldaig Primary

Successes

- The pupils enjoyed their recent school trip to Eilean Donan Castle as part of their social studies topic, Knights and Castles.
- The pupils have all enjoyed the ASG sporting activities which have been organised.

- Earlier in the term, the school supported the British Heart Foundation, by wearing red.
- For World Book Day, everyone dressed up as their favourite character and the money raised was sent to Book Aid International.
- Annual pantomime in the village hall was well attended by the whole community.
 Donations from this and our community Christmas card delivery service, raised £99 for CHAS.

Teachers who teach at the school but are centrally employed are excluded.

Pre-school staff information from Pre-School Census collected Sept 2014. For school nursery staff full time equivalent hours have been calculated on 35 hours per week.

Core staffing is calculated using the Highland Staffing Model, which takes account of national agreements for P1 to P3 class sizes. As a result, all primaries in this ASG are staffed according to the model.
